

# SHOW OF HANDS COLLECTIVE

# WHEN CLARE BONNET AND HEIDI HOCKENJOS MOVED TO STROUD, THEY WERE WELCOMED BY A VIBRANT CREATIVE COMMUNITY AND READY TO FIND THEIR PLACE IN IT. THEN A GLOBAL PANDEMIC HAPPENED.

As many of us began a working life of Zoom calls and lonely lunches, artists and makers were trying to create beauty and reflect truth without their usual creative stimuli

Quite apart from feeling alone, with no one to bounce ideas off of or at least feel in tune with, some artists were now faced with a complete uncertainty over their livelihood. Like many industries, the art world has suffered from a lack of opportunities to exhibit work and create income. Meanwhile, art lovers have missed out on their usual inspirations.

Clare, a fine art painter, describes the effect of successive lockdowns as "super isolating". Having previously worked from Jamaica Street Studios in Bristol, a collective of 40 professional artists, she found herself working alone from the studio in her garden. Heidi, a goldsmith and jewellery designer, also found herself working alone, removed from the thriving creative community of our town. They both describe their love for Stroud; a place with "a creative scene" where "things feel achievable" for artists.

Clare and Heidi soon struck up a friendship. They were both pleased to find that they felt the same: isolated and disempowered by the effects of the global situation. They were both looking for somewhere to show and sell their new works. And so, Show of Hands collective was born.

They are creating networks for makers in the South West to connect and help each other. If there is one thing that we have all learned in the last year and a half, it is the power of collective work.

Clare and Heidi certainly weren't alone in their feelings. As they began to speak to artists about joining the collective, they found that some of the creatives they spoke to were also looking for connection and community in these difficult times. Their first foray into the public sphere will be a gallery sale created by artists for artists and art lovers alike. They have joined forces with more than 20 artists who will all be exhibiting works including paintings, jewellery, woodwork and sustainable fashion.

Many of the artists are from Stroud, with others from Bristol, Devon and Cornwall. The collective plan to keep developing networks across the South West and hope to hold future pop ups in a variety of Cotswold locations. Knowing that so many industries have been affected by the pandemic, they are looking to give empty shop fronts and venues a breath of fresh air with creative exhibitions.

Most of the works have been created since March 2020 and each artist will rotate pieces as they are sold, so it will be worth revisiting their first showcase throughout the month. Clare and Heidi will both be present in the gallery every day. The many other artists involved will also have a presence, so that visitors can discuss the pieces and meet their makers.

Clare tells me that many of the artists are also parents. They have spent the last 18 months designing and creating whilst juggling home schooling, breastfeeding and caring for children in uncertain times, making these works a powerful reminder of the creative spirit.

They are also very excited to tell me about the launch party, which takes place on Friday, December 3rd at SVA. An evening of fireside live music, mulled wine and stunning art will be set against the backdrop of Stroud's vibrant goodwill evening.

There is a real feeling of something fresh and new when I speak with Heidi and Clare. Clare describes to me the feeling that all of the rules are changing, so they decided to try things "on our own terms".

For them, Covid has 'changed the creative landscape'. This is a time for 'allowing new discussions, fresh collaborations and a dynamic approach to art practices'. Finding new ways to 'connect, move forward and thrive' as artists has led them to a moment where they are ready to take the 'post-pandemic creative market into our own hands'.

As the collective put it: 'artists are becoming curators, marketeers, gallery owners, writers and managers on top of their art practice'. This exhibition gives us an even more direct connection to the artists making things in our local area. Clare and Heidi tell me that whilst this is an experimental approach, it feels like "empowerment for artists".

In the last year artists have faced 'financial insecurity, health concerns, gallery closures, cancelled commissions and a government that has turned away from the creative industries'. Amongst all of this, creatives have gone on creating. Making beautiful things to give our lives meaning. As Winter approaches,

we're all looking for the places that hold light for us and art can be that light. The space that Clare and Heidi describe to me is not just an exhibition, and certainly not just a place to buy beautiful things, but a curated space filled with eclectic objects to inspire and uplift even the weariest soul this December.

#### THE ARTISTS

Clare's work explores repetition in womanhood – generational cycles, entrenched societal expectations and the personal stories that link us all. She creates paintings that are rooted in the Narrative of Female: past, present, and future.

**Heidi** uses recycled gold and precious stones alongside hand-cut semi-precious stones to create jewellery that is colourful, delicate and tactile.

Clare and Heidi will be joined by, amongst others:

In House, the print studio and online store founded by Hayley and Marcus Walters, will be showing their colourful works. They use silk screens to print textures and patterns, before overlapping to build layers of

**Alex Merry**, a full time illustrator who has recently worked for Gucci, also paints detailed portraits of pets and people.

Popalini and Jezando make collaborative wheelthrown tea-ware and slipped terracotta tableware. They take influence from the traditional pottery of north Devon and combine it with the subtle, understated forms that they admired whilst researching wood firing in Japan.

**Lorraine Robbins** creates vessels with simple, classic forms capitalising on the making process itself to create bold and colourful pieces with uniquely textured and tactile surfaces.

Other exhibiting artists include the Darn Collective, Rachael McDonnel, Eily O Connell, Maxim Hastings, Dan Ablitt, Emma Studd, James Green, Nigel Noyes, Dan Parry Jones, Emmeline Hastings, Loopy Ewes and more...

The exhibition runs from Saturday December 4th to Thursday 23rd at SVA Gallery, John Street. Open Tuesdays to Saturdays 10am – 5pm. Open on Mondays by appointment and open every day from December 18th to 23rd. The launch party takes place on Fri 3rd December from 5:30 - 8:30pm. #### **EXHIBITION SPACE:**

### PHOEBE HATHAWAY

I AM A FREELANCE ARTIST WORKING LOCALLY IN STROUD, THE TOWN WHERE I GREW UP AND WHERE MY LOVE OF ART BEGAN. AFTER FINISHING SECONDARY SCHOOL, I STUDIED A FOUNDATION COURSE IN ART AND DESIGN AT STROUD COLLEGE, WHERE I DISCOVERED ILLUSTRATION.

What drew me to illustration is that the more I learnt about it, the more diverse it became. I realised the subject could range from a decorative design on a perfume bottle, a humorous political cartoon to an interactive installation piece.

After College, I went on to study at Falmouth University, which was an incredible place to live and be creative. There I learnt about digital art and soon became familiar with software like Photoshop and Illustrator. Using digital techniques to develop my work, I became fascinated with creating iridescent shapes with grainy textures, often forming surreal landscapes and atmospheric moods.

I think I am most inspired by the weird and wonderful aspects of the natural world. To me, nothing is more inspiring than the way light bounces off ripples in a stream or the intricate structure of a plant. My work is often a reflection of something I have seen that inspired me or on a concept I am interested in at the time. It can also just be an excuse to experiment with a painting or digital technique.

Now in my twenties living back in Stroud, I work on design projects in my free time, often commissioned by friends and local businesses. I am proud to have worked on Action on Plastic's logo and website rebranding - an organisation from Stroud, who provide information on how we can all reduce our plastic waste.

Over the past year I have painted Murals around the local area. One of which was displayed in the window of Thistle by Nature's botanical studio for a pop up yule shop.. Another piece of work which can be seen in Stroud is at The Kingshead pub in Kingscourt which features a garden mural of Bees, Butterflies and wildflowers.

I enjoy working on larger scale projects, festival sets and sign painting, as well as working on websites and digital media.

### MARA SIMPSON AND ALEXANDRA HAMILTON-AYRES

BEFORE SHE MOVED TO STROUD, **MUSICIAN AND STORYTELLER** MARA SIMPSON WAS LIVING IN **BRIGHTON. IN EARLY 2020, WHILST** ON THE BEACH, COLLECTING FIELD RECORDINGS WITH AWARD-WINNING FILM COMPOSER ALEXANDRA HAMILTON-AYRES, THE PAIR CHANCED UPON A **SOLITARY FIGURE STARING OUT** TO SEA LIKE A GHOST IN A M.R. **JAMES STORY, "A WOMAN WITH** LONG HAIR IN A FLOWING WHITE **GOWN WAS LEANING OVER** THE WAVES ON THE EDGE OF A PEBBLE RIDGE AND WE COULD SEE HER HAIR AND DRESS FLYING IN THE WIND COMING FROM THE SEA," REMEMBERS ALEXANDRA, **"SHE WAS REALLY LEANING AND** I REMEMBER SAYING TO MARA **'CAN YOU SEE HER? IS SHE REAL?**"

The windblown ghost was perhaps an early warning of the extratropical cyclone which hit the UK in February that year. "With the Storm Ciara news, we just got totally hooked with the idea this character embodied the storm," continues Alexandra, "It was also just as the pandemic was about to start so there was this real sense

of impending something that we really wanted to channel "

The result of what the pair channelled can now be enjoyed as Ciara, an EP named after the windstorm and the woman, featuring four tracks composed around the field recordings. It is a startling concoction of cinematic folk electronica, with echoes of late period Talk Talk and neo classical artists Nils Frahm and Ólafur Arnalds. Opening track 'Bristol' immerses the listener in traffic and street noise before giving way to plangent piano chords and what sounds like a gentle stream. The pair clearly had fun assembling the field recordings but their combined talent avoids any accusations of self-indulgence, "We had the idea for this EP to be built from going on a walk together with a field recorder, not necessarily knowing what we'd find", says Mara, "and then going back to the studio to chop up what we'd captured, creating a pallet of beats we could then paint from." Both artists use the word beats, not in the sense of a dancefloor. but as percussive sounds including car doors slamming, clattering pots and bird song. "We knew on the first walk we wanted to make some beats with sound design" says Alexandra, "it was fun to try and make snares with the pebbles on the beach by kicking them. I think the sound for the EP evolved quite organically out of both of our sound

It was the pandemic which kickstarted Mara's blue-sky-thinking, to leave Brighton for "amazing" Stroud. That Alexandra was already in nearby Bristol was "an added bonus". The pair have both released excellent solo albums during the last 18 months too (Mara's In This Place and Alexandra's 2 Years Stranger are highly recommended), did the lockdown period help promote creativity? "I felt lucky that this EP and my LP were both begun just before the pandemic," says Mara, "It meant that there was a thread to continue and

something to keep me going. That thread became a bit of a lifeline for my mental health too, knowing I had something to work on with another person, albeit remotely, through such an unnerving time." Alexandra sees it a little more prosaically, "It was the only way I could keep going. I took on every project possible and sold a few things to keep afloat. I think that it definitely helped creatively too in the long run, being in one place for so long.' Is there a recent film she's composed for which GOP readers might enjoy? "I would recommend watching Long  $\bar{\text{Live}}$  My Happy Head which will be doing the festival rounds and on BBC soon! It was a great project to work on, I recorded with Her Ensemble and the score also blends sound design taking sounds and inspiration from MRI machines.'

At present there are no plans for the duo to perform Ciara live, so for now you'll have to use the imagery Alexandra created for the artwork as you listen. You may even notice something familiar, "Stroud certainly got us thinking about locations and how

we could define where we live with sound" she says, "When it came to capturing the visuals, the open sky of Rodborough Common resonated with the themes on the EP."



By Autumn is the first of two EPs that Philippe will release in the next few months, digitally initially with a view that they may be pressed together onto vinyl later. Like Mara Simpson and Voka Gentle, Philippe arrived in these valleys during the lockdown era and is another key player of an increasingly vibrant scene emerging from this difficult period. Philippe's music is sparse and beautiful, deep and vulnerable. Obvious reference points would be Radiohead at their most pastoral, Bon Iver's first record or Sparklehorse but it is his own voice and thoughts that emerge most clearly.

His songwriting is a solitary process, these songs came about from walks in the woods, listening to the earth before being worked through on guitar. In a difficult period, Philippe found himself unable to connect with the world as he would like and it is his ability to convey this that makes his music

so compelling. Lyrical themes touch upon mental health, notions of femininity, imminent political and climate crisis and yet, there is hope in his work, a sense that human beings can be resilient and that mere survival in these times can, in itself, be 'beautifully moving' as Philippe himself claims.

The recording process was much more collaborative, Philippe worked with Bristol based bassist Alex Heane and Stroud's own drummer and engineer Rob Pemberton. Rob has worked with a range of key Stroud based acts as diverse as Emily Barker, Maja Lena and Wooolheads and Philippe is another who sings Rob's praises. "Rob is a wonderful presence, he's egoless but never absent. What I love about both Alex and Rob is that they really listen to what a particular song needs and the moment is asking for" he says.


In this particular case, what the moment called for was the simplicity of Philippe's voice and guitar and this is what we get, a stripped back sound that really lets the songs speak for themselves. Lead off track Loam is about human potential and what we are capable of, while Mud, another standout track explores a dance with femininity as the protagonist emerges from a journey into a murky experience. It ends with a refrain of 'my adoration, my devotion' which is as heartbreaking as it is gorgeous.

The EP is being released through London based label Off Peak run by Polly Mitchell. Polly is another key player in Philippe's emerging career, providing

direction, acting as a sounding board and supporting him in bringing his own voice to the fore. This allows Philippe to concentrate on the music and his interest in visual art (the packaging for By Autumn includes an art print that will support the release).

Thoughts are turning already to live dates and while Philippe dreams of supporting slowcore legends Low or Sufjan Stevens, he is setting his sights more realistically in the first instance with some intimate dates to build his audience. Stroud's next opportunity to see him play will be supporting Voka Gentle at the SVA Goods Shed on 27th November where he will play with a full band. A solo Stroud date is also planned for the Prince Albert (theprincealbertstroud.co.uk) in February next year as part of Independent Venue Week (date tba) in the meantime enjoy By Autumn.

### BECKY DELLOW

BECKY DELLOW STILL RECALLS THE DISAPPOINTMENT OF GETTING A TOY TRUMPET FOR CHRISTMAS WHEN SHE WAS SIX YEARS OLD. "I REALLY, REALLY WANTED A TRUMPET AND MY HEART SANK WHEN I OPENED THE PARCEL AND FOUND IT WAS PLASTIC," SHE SAYS.

But also under the tree was a beautiful antique French fiddle from her grandfather. It was the start of a life-long love of the instrument and indirectly led to Becky, now in her late 40s, launching her first album, Take Her Out and Air Her. at the Prince Albert last month.

As a child, Becky accompanied her fiddle-playing father and grandfather when they played at family events. Later, at Stroud High School, she studied violin to Grade 8 and joined a barn dance band run by teacher Pete Hendy, who sadly passed away this year and to whom the album is dedicated. He was helped by folk musician and fellow teacher Jeff Gillett, with whom Becky has collaborated on and off for more than 30 years.

After doing a degree in music, she moved back to Stroud and got involved with the local folk scene. But after she started a family, she was too busy to devote much time to music. "I'd also started to get stale playing the same repertoire," she admits. "My playing had become mechanical and I felt a bit flat." Then her mother died in tragic circumstances, and Becky found a kind of emotional catharsis in music. "Playing helped me find some peace and be content with my grief. Irish tunes in particular have a thoughtfulness, a plaintiveness. They just do something to my soul."

A chance encounter with poet Adam Horovitz was to reinvigorate Becky's career. Hearing that Becky's grandfather, Charles Hampton, had played fiddle with Laurie Lee, Adam suggested collaborating on a project he was planning based on Lee's poetry. They also worked together on podcasts inspired by poet and fiddle player John Clare. Through that, Becky met Lukas Drinkwater of Polyphonic Studio, who was later to produce - and play on - Take Her Out and Air Her. (The

title track is a traditional tune that Becky discovered when organising an academic conference.) Becky loved their collaboration. "Lukas is intuitive and musically brilliant. We had so much fun multilayering tracks. Garden of Butterflies, for example, has four fiddle tracks overlaid on each other." In turn, Lukas introduced Becky to fiddle player Kit Hawes (formerly of folk band Sheelanagig), who accompanied her at the album launch.

Meanwhile, she was having online lessons with fiddle player Martin Hayes. Despite already being proficient technically and academically (Becky studied musicology and music history as a mature student, gaining first an MA then a PhD), Becky believed there was more to learn. "I wanted to merge my practical and academic knowledge to give my music more depth. Martin showed me how to play from the heart: not just bashing out a tune mechanically but combining lyricism and lightness of touch with a rhythmic pulse." This learning process would never have happened if not for the lockdown, which had given Martin time to teach and Becky time to practice. "It was chaos at home as the house was full of people and dogs!" she says. "But suddenly I felt like I had been injected with something. I couldn't put the fiddle down."

Reinvigorated, Becky planned an album that, while mainly new arrangements of traditional Irish tunes, would not sound like a pub session. "I wanted to go deeper and achieve authentic expression, without the music being overly orchestrated." Some tracks – as typical of Irish folk – are melancholy. False, False, for example, tells the age-old tale of a girl abandoned by her lover. "Yet it's not all doom and gloom," says Becky. "There is a rhythmic, driving feel, a sense of hope, and that mood reflects the strange feeling of being in lockdown."



Acknowledging the influence that Martin had on the sound of the album, Becky observes: "Some people will say I'm just a poor man's Martin Hayes, that I'm just trying to be like him. Of course I'm trying to be like him! He is the best Irish fiddler." She was also heavily influenced by Sam Sweeney, who composed Steppy Down Roads, one of the two originals on the album. But Becky's musical input is very much present too; indeed, the other original track, Ruskin Mill. is her composition.

Becky's daughter Milly, who sings on the album and designed its cover, studied classical violin and is the sixth generation of the family known to have played the fiddle. Becky's great-greatgrandfather, Thomas Hampton, handed down a handwritten fiddle manuscript that subsequently became part of the research for Becky's doctorate.

Becky finds Stroud a nurturing space to do creative projects. "I feel very safe here to express myself musically. My album won't be liked by everyone but I do feel it will be accepted." She admits she struggled with the administrative aspects of producing an album. "Playing my fiddle is the fun bit. I had to really push myself out of my comfort zone to knuckle down to the difficult things. Getting the artwork produced, learning about barcoding, filling out the performing rights forms, doing publicity when I express myself better through music than through words. It was a steep learning curve." But is she satisfied with the result? "When we finished the album, I felt I wanted to record the tracks all over again!" she replies. "Apparently that's quite a normal feeling. You have to accept an album as a snapshot in time, get it out of your system and move onto the next project."

Becky doesn't expect to make money from the album. "It's more about being taken seriously, opening up opportunities to work as a professional musician, getting my name out there so that venues and promoters will have confidence they can sell all the tickets for a Becky Dellow gig." No more pub gigs, though. "They don't satisfy my soul anymore," muses Becky. "In a pub everyone is talking, drinking, even dancing. I want people to really listen to the tunes, as they would do at a classical concert. I want gigs that aren't about just bashing out fast tunes, that allow me to play more contemplatively, with subtle nuances that really express the beauty of the tunes."

Becky is treating her absence from serious music-making as a positive. "My maturity is adding depth to my music. I feel like I've packed 30 years' worth of learning and practising and improving into just a couple of years. I'm playing in a more subtle and nuanced way than I ever have before. I am a different - and a better – player. I've rediscovered my mojo."

### ADAM HOROVITZ

ADAM HOROVITZ
Love and Other Fairy Tales
Indigo Dreams

So Adam Horovitz begins his poem Stopping with a bicycle on a hill above Stroud, thinking of Ivor Gurney, one of the many splendidly evocative pieces in his new collection Love and Other Fairy Tales. The collection includes a satisfying wodge of local poems, of course, a homage to the five valleys that he loves the most, and yet Adam's latest works also take the reader to London and Warwickshire. Herefordshire, Sunderland, Edinburgh, and even Germany, where the lines 'My father moves through a clenched box/of sunlight caught between trees/ radiant in his sweat-dishevelled suit./His smile is child-like, a little lost/in the streets of a home he can't remember,' weep beautifully and solemnly from the poem Returning to Frankfurt, a poignant memory of the last trip that he took with his father, the poet Michael Horovitz, who was born in the city and who died suddenly this year.

"Some of the poems in the book are about my father, of course," Adam admits candidly. "After all, I grew up surrounded and immersed in the music of poetry. My mother (the poet and broadcaster Frances Horovitz) died when I was twelve and I started writing poetry in order to converse with her." He is keen, however, to point out that the book is not wholly autobiographical and, with a slight smile, he adds, "Those who know me best may be able to work out which ones are, but I'm not sure." Written on Shrove Tuesday thinking of Seder, February in the Physic Garden, 42nd Dream of You, Holiday in Arden - these are but four of the thirty-nine poems in the book. Do you recognise yourself in any of them?

Could one of these have been written about you?

Love and Other Fairy Tales is Adam's third full collection of poetry and is, to all intents and purposes, a continuation of his first collection, Turning, which was published in 2011. "A lot of the new poems were ready in 2013," he says, "although I got distracted by other projects. The book is about love in many forms. It's the culmination of ten years of interrupted work. I'm still very proud of my first collection. I like the sense of development as I move from book to book."

Much of Adam's poetry is about humanity's relationship with the land - meditations inspired by walking in nature, not just in Stroud but all across Britain, and even in Europe. Indeed, a third of Love and Other Fairy Tales was written in a little wooded glen in a castle thirty miles outside of Edinburgh. "Inspired by my time in Scotland, a lot of the poems are about woodlands," he says. "That valley was an echo of the Stroud valley." But Adam doesn't hide in a wooded alen, a poet's bunker, safely camouflaged by flowers and trees, he is also at home wandering through, and pondering on, the city streets of urban sprawl. In I Used to Walk Through London, my absolute favourite poem in the book, he vividly recalls, 'I used to walk through London/ and always the edge lands/drew my eye, the sharp borders/between estates where decay/and order met - the wildernesses/where willowherb and ivy/ argued for space amongst bricks.' In fact, the regular changes in landscape from poem to poem help to create an eclectic scrapbook of moods, and

it keeps the collection alive throughout. "I always carry a notebook wherever I go," he explains, and he wanders far and wide, as all poets should.

It's so easy chatting with Adam about poetry, especially as we both share a mutual passion for lyrical writers. His love for Laurie Lee and Dylan Thomas, and for many other folk and Celtic voices, shines through with a refreshing honesty that you'd might not immediately expect from the child of literary heavyweights. But his father believed that poetry should always challenge the establishment. "It should counter Thatcherite arrogance and near fascistic xenophobia," Michael Horovitz once said, and Adam, himself, is quick to quote the late, great Adrian Mitchell, a family friend, who once claimed that "most people ignore most poetry because most poetry ignores most people." You would do well not to ignore Love and Other Fairy Tales, it really is a wonderful book.


