





# MERLIN SHELDRAKE

## BIOLOGIST, AUTHOR, LEADING VOICE IN THE COMPLEXITIES OF FUNGAL LIFE AND NEW STROUDIE, MERLIN SHELDRAKE FURTHER DELVES INTO THE WORLD OF FUNGI, WITH HIS FILM 'FUNGI: WEB OF LIFE.' IN THIS NEW OFFERING MERLIN AND TEAM PRESENT FRESH PERSPECTIVES ON FUNGAL BEHAVIOUR IN A CAPTIVATING, MULTIDIMENSIONAL EXPERIENCE.

Merlin's new film offers a fascinating journey into the mysterious world of fungi. The movie is a unique collaboration with K2 Studios who sparked Merlin's interest with the opportunity to present fungal life in an unconventional way. The film is narrated by Björk, on the suggestion of Merlin's wife Erin who knew the magic and mystery of the fungal world would be best explained by an ethereal tone.

Rather than a direct replication of his book 'Entangled Life,' the film draws inspiration from Merlin's inspiring talks and the vibrant concept of the new illustrated edition of his book. Working with the same image makers who contributed to the book, Merlin's team worked to illuminate the captivating diversity and enigmatic beauty of fungi through moving imagery and in doing so they began to challenge established perceptions of individuality and even intelligence.

Merlin feels one of the film's most compelling aspects is its manipulation of perspective using the giant canvas of the IMAX screen to take the audience on a transformative journey. The movie uses scale and time to blur the boundaries between the familiar and the unfamiliar. By playing with temporal elements, the movie confuses and challenges the limitations of our human senses to offer a multidimensional experience.

Favourite scenes of Merlin's are the time lapses, a highlight being an acorn sequence that captured mycorrhizal fruit growing from an acorn and ensnaring the roots as a rare glimpse into the intricate behaviours of fungi. Merlin describes fungal life as a cryptic and mesmerising world and with film we can experience fungal events unfolding on a timescale outside the scope of our observation.

The majority of the scenes have been captured using cinematography, use of CGI effects was limited to capturing only those sequences inaccessible to cameras.

Through exploration, the film sheds light on the temporal realm fungi inhabit, illustrating not only their unique relationship with time but also their unusual strategies for travelling and eating. Fungi infiltrate and grow within their food, absorbing nutrients by extending their bodies into their food source rather than through ingestion, and they travel slowly by expanding into and across their environment providing a new way to see time and space. (Unfortunately this approach to time and space doesn't link to fungi being extraterrestrial, on this Merlin is clear, while fungal spores are tough enough to withstand interplanetary travel, genetic studies confirm their terrestrial origins, all fungi evolved here on Earth.)

Merlin is a fresh face in Stroud, choosing this spot to be close to friends and our beautiful valleys he's come to know so well. His love for the great outdoors goes back to his childhood spent exploring the 'decomposers' around his Hampstead Heath home. He was fascinated by how organic matter magically disappeared. Those early days ignited his fascination with the superpower of decomposition. This fascination is why Merlin is a strong believer of the importance of incorporating the vibrant, exciting, living world and how we are deeply connected to it into our education system.

Speaking of education, Dr Sheldrake kindly answered questions from two of Stroud's fungally fascinated folks Ryan Kelly, previously of Thistledown and now Caper fame and Greg Pilley of Stroud Brewery:

Ryan: Are there natural systems and structures that we can learn from, perhaps other ways of organising society?

Dr Sheldrake: Fungi helps us to redefine individuality and provides a new point of view that challenges the concept of units and boundaries. In the modern post industrial world, humans have been treated as units, this doesn't allow for the vast amount of organisms that live on our bodies, and how our bodies are inextricably entangled with organisms outside of our bodies. As we take on this new point of view it will become harder for us to justify our ecocide behaviours of pollution, extraction and exploitation. As powerful decomposers, fungi challenge the dysfunctional human concept of waste and by assimilating the behaviours of fungi we can begin to <u>design better production systems</u>.

Greg: What advice would you give to a new community compost scheme here in Stroud in terms of value to growing nutrient wealth through a local nutrient economy?


Dr Sheldrake: There is great value to maintaining a nutrient economy and that is 100% the way society should be thinking moving forwards. A community composting scheme allows value to stay in the local system, for example the ingredient value of spent hops or coffee grounds becomes non-existent post use if they become waste, but they retain value if they are used for something else such as nutrient dense compost for the community and local environment. Local compost schemes can become a goldmine for a self-sustaining, nutrient-rich economy. By diverting organic waste from landfills and transforming it into nutrient-rich compost, these schemes bolster the local nutrient cycle. The resulting compost serves as a valuable resource for local agriculture and gardening, enriching the soil, promoting plant growth and promoting a healthier, more productive community. Not to mention the reduced carbon footprint from keeping things local.

If you have your own questions about the wonderful world of fungi, I can highly recommend a walk through Woodchester listening to the audio version of Merlin's eye opening book 'Entangled Life' and I for one will be going to watch the film...

SHOW OF HANDS X SACRED THING

## HOW ARTISTS ARE PART OF THE SOLUTION FOR REVIVING OUR HIGH STREETS...

Occupying a former high street bank of Stroud could not be a more perfect venue to display some of the area's most talented artists and makers. Skill in craft and the sacredness of handmade objects is the commodity being exchanged. But that is not the only commodity Barnie Page, Clare Bonnet and Heidi Hockenjos are hoping to initiate with this collaboration. During our interview, it was clear how important contact and connection is for artists' health and well-being. A shop front presence facilitates happenchance encounters that can support or instigate valuable relationships between patron and artist as well as peers.

What is this attachment to high street shops? Can the work not just be marketed and sold online? Once a year artists' spaces open to the public for the open studio trails allowing a fleeting glimpse with artists and their work. This has its place, however, without the high street presence, Barnie points out that we are missing out on the "chance encounters and serendipitous moments". In regards to virtual spaces, his response is "There is so much noise online and so many algorithms that get in the way of finding an audience...it is difficult to break through those algorithms in the first place". It is the spirit of happenchance encounter that seeded this collaboration. SOH is artists claiming back tactile experiences with the work, what Heidi refers to as "touch points", where the work can be held, worn and reimagined. So while the high street banks are moving their business online the makers are interested in moving their work back into the shops.

But it is not so straightforward or accessible for many artists and start up creative businesses to find spaces. SOH 2023 has only been possible because of the generosity and support of a friend, the new proprietor of the building.

"My frustration comes with the lack of initiative on the council's behalf to make it easier for young fledgling businesses or creatives to use those spaces," Clare explains. She questions whether there is a missed opportunity to "join up the dots" between the council, landlords, and creatives making these empty spaces more accessible, benefiting the community and adding to the vibrancy of Stroud's town centre. Heidi points out the lack of presence in town and the growing number of empty shops does not reflect the diverse and exciting culture of Stroud. "Stroud is such a melting pot for some really interesting people and a variety of creative businesses." The opportunities for Stroud's creatives to be visible are few and far between.

Another shared ethos of this venture is making art accessible to invest in, breaking through barriers and preconceived ideas of who can be an art collector. Do you need to be attending contemporary art fairs, or following Sotheby's catalogs? Curator Barnie Page believes anyone can be a collector. It is not an exclusive club for the intellectually elite. "Just buy what you love" is advice he often gives. Jewellery maker Heidi shares her vision of a space where fine craft sits beside fine art on equal terms, where "all these things are equal and just as beautiful". To reflect this ethos SOH 2023 will have a selection of collectible hand-crafted items for sale at a range of prices.

Let's fill the shops of our dwindling high streets with creativity, not the

cardboard cut-out examples of profit and economic growth we have seen rise and fall. Stroud is unique, full of spirit and ingenuity. All we need to do is turn up and invest in our hearts and minds.

# RADIOLARIANS

## THE FIRST RELEASE FROM KLANG TONE RECORDS' NEWLY-LAUNCHED LABEL, "WONKY BEDSIT ELECTRONICA" RECORD RADIOLARIANS IS ALREADY GARNERING NATIONAL ATTENTION. JAKE NEWBY TALKS TO STROUD-BASED CREATOR DAVID CUDLIP...

Named after a form of microscopic ocean-dwelling plankton, the debut solo album from locally-based musician David Cudlip has been making waves since its release last month. Radiolarians was acclaimed as "unbelievably good" by renowned music magazine Electronic Sound in a glowing write-up that likened it to the work of electronic music leviathans Autechre and Harmonia.

Not bad for an album described by Cudlip as recorded "guickly and spontaneously" in the space of around a week. Though there is, of course, a bit more to it than that. "It took me 30 years and one week really," says Cudlip, who began making music as a teenager, inspired in part by seeing the likes of London punk band Snuff play in Stroud (with tickets just a couple of guid) Stints in various bands followed before Cudlip found musical kinship with two friends further north; having moved to Durham for university, he ioined a psychedelic rock outfit (who would eventually become known as Oares) in Yorkshire.

This was the 1990s however, and just as the trio were building momentum, "the music industry collapsed" as Cudlip puts it. "Just as we were about to kind of achieve something, the industry just went boom," he says. "It was weird. One minute you're sending off tapes and you're getting letters back from record companies and then suddenly... just nothing. You could sense the fact that all of the energy, all of the air, all of the money had gone."

While this forced the guitarist to reappraise his dreams of appearing on the cover of the NME or Melody

Maker, it didn't stop him making music, both with Ogres – a group he still works with today – and as a solo artist. "I was always making music," says Cudlip. "The moment I got my hands on a multi-track machine, I remember thinking, 'Now I can do stuff'. It was like magic. You can put one sound on top of another on top of another. And for years I just did that. I was so thrilled by the possibility that you could just layer sounds. And I didn't do anything about writing songs or structuring anything – it was just that pure process of doing the sounds."

Having begun his experiments using a four-track cassette recorder. todav Cudlip is more used to working with the dizzying array of tools offered up by cutting edge production software. Yet Radiolarians was born of a more back-to-basics approach. "Logic Pro does everything you can imagine," Cudlip explains. "And then you kind of think, 'Oh, if I had that guitar, or if I had that synth, or if I had that recording interface then I would be finally able to do something.' You just get obsessed with this stuff and there's whole magazines devoted to it: 'All you need is this 1,500 guid thing, and then suddenly you'll be great.' I just thought, 'I really need to stop thinking like that and just make some music as well as I can with the stuff that I've got."

The self-imposed constraints ended up giving him a kind of freedom. "I limited myself to two pieces of equipment: I just used a drum machine and a synth, with pedals for the effects. I was reading about Autechre who said in an interview that they hadn't bought any new gear in the last five years, they just wanted to use the tools they'd got - if you want to express yourself you have to learn to use your equipment properly. So that was the kind of idea. And then I didn't do that, I just did ten songs really quickly in about a week. But I think that's sort of the impetus behind it: what happens if you impose some limitations on yourself so that you're just forced to actually think about what you're doing, rather than just pressing a button that makes a cool sound?'

The answer in the case of Radiolarians is fascinating, pulsating electronic music – with plenty of "cool sounds" regardless. Pulling in influences from Spacemen 3, early Kraftwerk and, of course, Autechre, the record splices together driving beats with slightly off-kilter melodies to make for an absorbing debut. It's spiky and otherworldly, much like the sea creatures from which it derives its name.

"It breathes," as Cudlip puts it. "I was very conscious of having it have a pulse. It feels quite alive." It was this sense of the music being "alive" and having a "pulse" that gave the project its name, with Cudlip going down a Google rabbit hole after coming across radiolarians in Bugs Britannica. He decided to use the term for both the whole project and the title of the record, with each track name derived from a different variety of the marine plankton.

Given there are more than 15,000 species of radiolaria. Cudlip isn't likely to run out of new song titles any time soon. Yet even if he were to produce a track for every species, it'd still be a drop in the ocean on today's musical landscape. The rise of technology may have made the process of releasing music arguably more accessible than it has ever been, but it's also led to a tidal wave of output that at times can feel overwhelming. In May, data company Luminate released a report claiming that 10.8 million new songs had been uploaded to streaming platforms in the first three months of 2023. That amounts to 120.000 tracks every day. "I get emails from [online record shop] Juno every week and there's so much being released and it's all really good," says Cudlip, throwing his hands up. "I want to own them all - it's financially ruinous. So you can have ideas, you can record those ideas, you can put them onto whatever format you like. But how do you get other people to hear that?"

Community can be key in such circumstances. That's where Klang Tone Records and its scene-building owner Sean Roe have come in. Radiolarians is the first release on Klang Tone's newly-launched label, with Roe describing Cudlip's sound as "like Aphex Twin jamming with Hans-Joachim Roedelius" in Good On Paper issue 101. Klang Tone has also secured distribution for the LP through legendary London record shop Honest Jon's and made Radiolarians



available overseas via their newlylaunched Bandcamp page.

The now-Lansdown-based record shop is also partly responsible for an enigmatic passage of text found on the sleeve of the limited edition vinyl version of the album. Klang Tone was the venue for a talk by DJ Food and Matthew Ingram in March as part of Stroud's Pop Up Sub-Culture Festival; after talking with Cudlip at the event and listening to Radiolarians, author and Woebot creator Ingram offered to pen some words for the LP. Similarly, the artwork for the album was put together by artist Graham Sefton (aka Detritus Plates), who heard and loved the record after connecting with Cudlip via an exhibition of his collages at Klang Tone. "Everyone kind of coalesced around it," Cudlip says, crediting locally-based producer Ed DMX with working wonders on the mastering as well.

And people continue, rightfully so, to gravitate toward the record – not that Cudlip is getting carried away just yet. "I'll take it one step at a time," he says. "The fact it exists at all is major progress."

## MANOAH

## "AN EXPERIENCE IN NATURE GOING BEYOND THAT OF AN OBSERVER; AT SOME POINT THE LANDSCAPE IS OBSERVING ME"

Alec Harrison (aka A Place from Manoah) would know. In order to write his latest record, he and his close friend Bill Merrick took a week-long voyage into the Welsh Hills in order to explore the inner and outer wilderness of nature and their own minds. They pitched up at a beautiful lake where, as Alec puts it "we wanted to deepen exploration into the uncharted realms of the psych..." The two men would mostly work separately throughout the day, playing guitar parts before reconvening each evening around the fire in order to share their work.

The results are revealed to the outside world this month via a 7 track EP called Songs From Cuckoo Lake – a reference to the choral accompaniment of their trip. The first five tracks were all written on the trip itself while the final two instrumental pieces were written immediately upon his return. The work is an engaging listen; shimmering guitars, folk lyrics and bright vocals create an uplifting mood rooted in the joy of the natural world. Alec's influences range from Brian Eno and Jon Hopkins to Juliana Barwick and Kurt Vile but his own music has very much its own sound and personality.

Nature has always played a key part in Alec's world since his Dorset childhood where he would climb trees and play in the sea. Born into a musical family he first picked up a bass guitar at the age of 10. By his early teens he had discovered jazz bass virtuoso Jaco Pastorius and had started his first band, Stentorian. Upon discovering the music of Michael Manring he revelled in the joys of detuning his instrument and in using piccolo strings and by the age of seventeen he was recording his own songs. He was attending Poole College but, by his own admission, he and close friend Alex Hedley would generally get stoned, spend all day noodling in the studio and all night jamming and listening to music in Hedley's garage.

Deciding to forgo University, he instead re-joined Stentorian to undertake a tour of New Zealand supplemented with busking with his fretless bass. It was upon his return, visiting old friend Alex that he first met Bill Merrick, an immediate chemistry developed between the three of them and this provided the key to the next stage of Alec's musical journey. They created a band named after Nick Drake's Saturday Sun and had a very successful career over a few years. They supported Sigur Ros and played a number of key shows in London as well as securing a record deal. Eventually the band ran out of steam and Alec left to pursue his solo work. It was in 2017 that Alec and Bill would work together again. They rented a house just outside Granada in Spain for six months, a location that Alec recalls as "a post-apocalyptic nightmare landscape high on some cliffs with constantly barking dogs." Despite this harsh environment, they formed a new psychedelic folk rock outfit. Upon their return to the UK they toured with a band called Hands Of The Heron and befriended singer Bea Piper – joining forces, The Good Beast was born.

The Good Beast was (excuse the pun) a very different beast from Alec's previous work - forceful, an assault on the senses – as anyone who saw their instore gig at Sound Records back in October will testify. Drawing on the spirit of Jefferson Airplane and Hawkwind but sounding somehow fresh they are a beguiling live act. Having completed their UK tour (of which Stroud was the last date) the band are currently reconfiguring and Alec doesn't really see himself as part of their plans in the immediate term. Instead he wants to focus on his solo work. For now, this involves firstly releasing the EP and then, with a short break in South Africa in between, some live dates "in interesting venues" to follow. Stroud will no doubt form part of this musical tapestry so keep your eves peeled.

Manoah is a Hebrew name meaning rest and at the end of our conversation I asked Alec the

significance of this. "There is undoubtedly a spiritual dimension to my music – it's what informs and inspires my work. Music should take the listener on a journey, to a place" he says "If it's not doing that, then what is it doing?." This is a musician who clearly lives and breathes his music and we look forward to his sharing it...

## "WE WANT TO BRING TOGETHER THE THREADS OF LITERATURE AND COMMUNITY," ENTHUSES MADELEINE BUNTING OF FIRST THURSDAY PAINSWICK, "IT'S MUCH MORE THAN JUST THE BOOKS, THEY'RE JUST THE CENTRAL HUB OF IT," ADDS DR SANDRA RANDLE, FELLOW CO-FOUNDER.

"It's something I didn't know I wanted to do until I started doing it. It just feels so... right," Sandra Randle is telling me over Zoom from the cosiness of her living room on a very wet and windswept afternoon in Painswick. We're chatting about First Thursday Painswick, a book event which takes place, as you might've guessed, on the first Thursday of every month at The Painswick Centre. "Yes, and you know, arriving in a new neighbourhood and getting involved in something like this, where you feel you're offering something, you're putting something back in. I like that sense of contributing to community life. That's important," Madeleine Bunting adds. And it's clear within the first few minutes of our chat that these impressive women, along with their fellow cofounder, local photographer, Anne-Marie Randall, are not only the sort of people who get things done and make stuff happen, but they do it with heart.

Like Sandra and Madeleine, I uprooted my family from the buzz of a big city and settled into the peaceful countryside surrounding Stroud in recent years, not knowing what, if anything, would be accessible to feed my cultural craving. Little did I know that the creative industry; writers, artists, poets, performers, the list is endless, in and around these lush valleys is indeed an industry in and of its own making. An industry thriving with heart and soul. And what Sandra, Anne-Marie and Madeleine have created in First Thursday Painswick is no exception. Their book events feed into the rich and diverse tapestry of offerings by hosting an 'in conversation with..' evening with a different author every month, all with a glass of wine in hand, I mean, what could be more inviting.

Though their events are set up with a cosy, welcoming atmosphere, with Sandra bringing lamps and soft furnishing from home, don't think for a second that it's a womb-like sycophantic evening, "We are nurturing. But we're also guite tough. It's important to tackle the tough questions," Madeleine points out, "and our authors are willing to take the difficult questions because we hold people in a safe space." And I have no doubt that the interviews are anything other than compelling with Sandra and Madeleine taking it in turns as interviewer, along with locally acclaimed poet, Phillip Rush, and CEO of The Countryside Charity, Roger Mortlock. Madeleine is a highly acclaimed author of several non-fiction books as well as boasting a 25-year career as a journalist at The Guardian. And even though Sandra's opening accolade to me was that she 'owns eight alpacas and two miniature Shetland ponies' with a bit more digging, I discovered a long and successful career in academia as an anthropologist, writer, and entrepreneur. Here's what they had to tell me about First Thursday Painswick.



## HOW DID FIRST THURSDAY PAINSWICK COME ABOUT?

Sandra: Coming out of the pandemic, Anne-Marie and I set up a little pop-up shop to support local artists and makers to sell their work, it went really well and after three months, we opened a café. It all grew more quickly than we anticipated. We started selling books by local authors and then I said, 'why don't we do book events?'

Madeleine: I met Sandie through Anne-Marie and we hit it off straight away, it was a meeting of minds. We realised that we had a shared philosophy, a sort of set of ideas about the importance of local. Local authors, local issues, or books on issues of local relevance. The café was this incredibly warm, welcoming, community hub, so right from the beginning First Thursday was also about community building primarily and it soon became adopted by the village.

## HOW DO YOU FIND WHICH AUTHORS TO HOST EACH MONTH?

S: Well, one of our authors, Alexander Norman, was a direct result of the café. His dog, Doug the Pug, would arrive in the cafe every morning to get a treat. I'd chat about the book events and Alexander's wife said, 'well, Alexander's published you know'. So that was a really special little link that happened. You find people that you don't even know are in the village, who have a 25-year historical relationship with the Dalai Lama and has written the definitive biography of this world figure, and he lives two minutes away. And I met him because of his pug!

M: We decided to try and balance the authors we choose, so some are local authors, like Clover Stroud or Mary Portas, and some are authors of books we spot that we think people would be really interested in. Sarah Langford came last month and spoke about her book, Rooted: How regenerative farming can save the world, on sustainability and nature recovery, she ended up having very detailed discussions about crop rotation with some incredibly knowledgeable people in the audience.

## WHAT CAN PEOPLE EXPECT FROM THE EVENING?

S: It's very much a whole evening. People arrive from about 7pm into the cafe, the author will already be there, you can buy wine, it's very convivial, very relaxed. And then we'll all go upstairs for the actual author talk, which all-in-all is about an hour. Then back to the café for the book signing. There's always a noise and buzz in the room, a real sense of warmth. And we're very grateful for Stroud Bookshop's support in selling the books on the evening. M: Yes, and we've had such lovely responses from the authors too, they feel the warmth from the audience. You work in a sort of quiet loneliness when you write. Then to find people who have the same passion for books and have found in your writing something that they connect with is just so affirming. They get such a buzz out of it.

## WHAT'S NEXT FOR FIRST THURSDAY PAINSWICK?

**M:** Our mission really is to continue to build community through a shared love of books and literature.

S: Yes, we're a Community Interest Company, so we cover our running costs and any surplus we make from the events gets reinvested into local projects. We're thinking about running workshops, maybe something for young people who have an interest in writing, and older people who have stories to tell. We hope to bring those two things together, and help young people develop ideas around their writing, their technique, and at the same time build bonds of community.

At certain points in our interview, they break off to share updates with each other on the authors they host, getting enthused at news of recent publishing successes or exciting new ventures. It's clear that Sandra and Madeleine genuinely care about the people they champion at their events.

This month's First Thursday Painswick features Stephen Moss - one of the UK's most prominent nature writers discussing his latest book Ten Birds That Changed the World.
