

AK/DK 21:25 - 22:10

AK/DK create improvised layers of fuzzed-up synths, delays and thunderous double drums. Known for their high-energy and structural abandon as a live act, their stream of largely improvised layers of fizzing arpeggios and crushing motorik drums has earned them places on stages and at festivals all around the UK and Europe. They've performed at Latitude, End of The Road, ArcTanGent and Green Man, and have toured with Dan Deacon, The Dandy Warhols, Fujiya & Miyagi and Zombie Zombie. The two-piece have always loved the motorik of Kraftwerk and Can, bands that revelled in the journey as much as the destination. They also describe themselves as "like a chunkier Devo" – and, yes, there's a warmth to the textures of their music from the modular synths and other self-built pedals in their set up, while there's a driving rhythmic constancy too.




COLLEGE 22:50 - 23:5

College is David Grellier, a legendary French electronic music composer, born in 1979 in Nantes. In the late '90s he acquired his first computer with which he produced several demos influenced by artists such as Jeff Mills and Aphex Twin, and labels such as Soma Records, Peacefrog and Warp. In 2007 he started Valerie, a blog that has evolved to become a record label and an expanding cultural network of international artists. 2011 saw Nicolas Winding Refn choose 'A Real Hero' by College feat. Electric Youth as the theme song for his acclaimed and awardwinning film Drive, propelling College into mainstream consciousness and securing him support across publications such as Pitchfork, Consequence of Sound and The Line of Best Fit. College, in Grellier's words, was an attempt "to synthesise into my music the emotions of my childhood" and was greatly influenced by American 1980s pop-culture, "80's soaps and an aesthetic which I particularly like: colour, images, silvery films and the sun – images of Los Angeles, Chicago and all of the other cities that continue to fascinate me...



THE UMLAUTS 20:00 - 20:45

There are few things in life guite as mesmerising or outrageously euphoric as the nine-strong Umlauts army effervescing in full force. Rebelling against labels, transcending borders of land and time - packed with twin vocalists equally competent in their skewering south-London drawl as they are in German, Italian or French - as in touch with the nostalgias of First-Generation post-punk or 80s pop as they are with the techniques of contemporary pop or big beat dance - the Umlauts are paragons of trans-europe excess, dripping with inarguable edge; ranging wildly from chaotic cool to bombastically exquisite order; invested with unhinging, socio-political bite, dancing in a rave of their own. The group played a memorable End of the Road Festival slot for their fourth ever show, and have since picked up slots at Wide Awake, Pitchfork Music Festival London and tour support with Shame, among others, as well as taking in airplay and plaudits from BBC 6music, NME, Loud & Quiet and more.




JOE MUGGS 00:05 - 01:00

Joe Muggs is best known as a music writer. having written for the likes of Mixmag, The Wire, FACT, The Guardian, Daily Telegraph, theartsdesk, Bandcamp and Boiler Room and is also the author of Bass, Mids, Tops: An Oral History of Soundsystem Culture, Crosstown Rebels: 20 Years of Madness, Magic and Music and another major new club music history for 2024 (to be announced in the spring). But he's also kept his hand in as a musician and DJ over the years, from the ultra-experimental to the party-rocking. You can be well assured he'll be leaning in the latter direction for the Good On Paper Party, and Stroud punters who've seen him play at Studio 18 or SVA in the past couple of years can testify that means 100% good times from start to end....

Monobrow is the proprietor of Sound Records and one of Stroud's best loved DJs. He is co-host of disco/house warehouse night Loose Joints and resident on Bristol's Noods Radio. Expect a heady mix of 80s pop, electro grooves and early rave classics...The spirit of acid house is strong in this one...



DISCO D'OLI 23:00 - 00:00

Disco D'Oli brings you a selection of deep, groove-led vinyl that distils the collectivist, loving spirit of house as it emerges from disco. Midwife DJ Oli holds the space for peace, liberation and healing - feel reborn on the dancefloor!



MENDOZA 21:00 - 22:00

Will Mendoza has been djing for aeons and his freeform cross-genre all-vinyl dj sets are a regular occurrence in and around Stroud. Will is one of the founders and organisers of Stroud Block Party and is the resident DJ at The Long Table in Brimscombe. He's bringing a set that features 80's tracks that embraced the advent of advancements in technology through the use of synths, drum machines and samplers in a manner that mirrors the development of arcade video games in this golden era. Mr Mendoza was heard to say he will be, "locked and loaded with 'electro arcade funk' to set things off.



MULLY JOWERS 20:00 - 21:00

Grower of veg and player of synths with wooden sides, Stroud based occasional musician Mully Jowers is a producer at leading experiential art collective Marshmallow Laser Feast, working on various immersive installations combining giant projections, interactions and sometimes VR in venues and spaces across the world. Mully will be driving his Sinclair C5 down from Randwick to play a set of Synthwave (also called outrun, retrowave, or futuresynth).



DUBBU 22:00 - 23:01

Born and raised in the GL5 postcode explains why Dubbu's love for Stroud runs so deep. Having spent his formative years experiencing his parents love for music it was certain that it would feature so heavily in his future. HipHop has always been a mainstay in his musical life and it's where musically his heart lies, although Funk, Soul and Reggae feature heavily in his sets.




MZ MONIQUE 19:00 - 20:00

Mz Monique was exposed to a wide variety of music from a young age. Being born on the Caribbean island of Dominica, where genres of music such as Bouyon, Calypso and Soca are in heavy rotation. Moving to the UK at the age of 4, she went on to be influenced by the music played in the family household by both her parents and her older brother and sister, from Jimmy Cliff to Doug E Fresh and even Prince. For the Good On Paper Party, her DJ selection will also reflect this musical diversity, with a throwback to the days when the only way to DJ was with analogue sounds! Expect hints of Roller-Disco Boogie and 80s Hip Hop infused with a Caribbean flavour!






MARK LEVY 80'S POSTER EXHIBITION



RACHEL



RACHEL MUSSON IS A SAXOPHONIST, IMPROVISER AND COMPOSER WHO NOW RESIDES IN STROUD.

She has spent the last decade immersed in improvised music, and has also gradually been introducing composed elements into her work, drawing on text, field recordings and processing sounds, which have come to the fore on her new album Ashes and Dust, Earth and Sky.

As a musician who has worked with some of the top improvisers in the country (and beyond) including the likes of Mark Sanders, Alex Ward, John Edwards, Hannah Marshall and Julie Kjaer, this latest solo outing is something new and different, a sonically immersive experience with multiple layers and textures, an immensely rewarding listen. I caught up with Rachel to talk about her life as a musician, the new record and future plans...

YOU ARRIVED FAIRLY RECENTLY IN STROUD. WHAT MADE YOU DECIDE TO MOVE HERE FROM THE CULTURAL AND MUSICAL HUB OF LONDON?

I moved to Stroud with my partner a few months ago to be closer to family, green space, with a vibrant arts scene.

HOW DID YOU BECOME INTERESTED IN THE SAXOPHONE, AND IN JAZZ?

I grew up in Porthcawl, taking up saxophone in my early teens. At the time it was home to quite an influential jazz summer school for adults that I started attending as soon as they'd let me in. It was ear-opening for me, and started my journey into jazz and improvised music.

AT WHAT POINT DID YOU CHOOSE TO FOCUS GREATER ATTENTION ON IMPROVISED MUSIC AND GROUP IMPROVISATION AS OPPOSED TO PERFORMING COMPOSITIONS? THERE'S A DISCERNIBLE DIFFERENCE IN APPROACHES BETWEEN YOUR FIRST RELEASE

'FLIGHT-LINE' (2011) AND THE TWO SUBSEQUENT RECORDINGS, 'TATTERDEMALION' (2012) AND 'BIBIMBAP' (2016) - HOW DID YOUR PLAYING EVOLVE OVER THIS PERIOD?

Life events led me to give up playing during my twenties. In my early thirties I came to regret this, and picked up the saxophone again, went back to college part-time to study jazz. Flight-Line was an attempt to reconnect to where I left off, but it soon became apparent that my playing didn't fit into the compositions I was writing, so I decided to follow my instinct and shift over to the improvised music scene.

YOUR MORE RECENT RECORDINGS FOR US BASED LABEL 577 RECORDS ARE BOTH QUITE DIFFERENT. 1 WENT THIS WAY'RELEASED IN 2020 IS AN EXPANSIVE PIECE FEATURING THE INTERPLAY OF 9 MUSICIANS WITH TEXTS AND SPOKEN WORD PLAYING AN IMPORTANT PART. 'DREAMSING' (2021) WAS YOUR DEBUT SOLO RECORDING ON TENOR SAX AND VOICE. COULD YOU SAY SOMETHING ABOUT THE IDEAS COMMON IN THESE TWO RECORDINGS?

577 Records have been really supportive, and I'm grateful for their enthusiasm for releasing my music. I Went this Way and Dreamsing were conceived at a similar time, so I think this was their biggest similarity. I think many improvisers go through phases where what they are practising informs their music, and these two albums are definitely from the same phase. I Went this Way was commissioned by Tony Dudley-Evans for a festival in Birmingham. Shortly after, 577 approached me with the idea of doing a solo album, and some of the sounds and themes from I Went this Way, along with snippets of the text I had used found their way into the solo piece. I recorded some of Dreamsing early in 2020, and then we all went into lockdown, and I recorded the remaining tracks when suddenly playing solo took on a whole new meaning..

YOUR FORTHCOMING ALBUM 'ASHES AND DUST, EARTH AND SKY / LLUDW A LLWCH, DAEAR A NEF' WILL BE OUT LATER THIS MONTH, HOW WERE THESE PIECES CONCEIVED AND RECORDED? IT FEELS LIKE A SHIFT IN DIRECTION, WITH MULTI-TRACKING, FIELD RECORDINGS AND ELECTRONICS? DID THE DYCP (DEVELOP YOUR CREATIVE PRACTICE) GRANT YOU RECEIVED ASSIST WITH THE EXPANSION OF YOUR SOUND PALETTE?

The pandemic brought home to me how fragile the live music scene was, and the sudden silencing of traffic and planes in London brought a whole new soundscape to the fore. The hiatus in playing led me to reflect on how I wanted my work to evolve, and exploring composition and recording was key. Ashes and Dust, Earth and Sky is a key result of the DYCP Arts Council England grant I received in 2021 which gave me a much needed psychological boost to take my composition seriously. One outcome of the project was a sound art installation at a studio in London called Project Divfuse. And then the key part of the project was this recording that I am releasing myself in February. A stated ambition for after the project was to begin to collaborate across art forms, so my next wish is to find some people who might like to add music or audio into their projects.

PERFORMING ON THE IMPROVISED MUSIC CIRCUIT HAS ITS DIFFICULTIES, AUDIENCES ARE COMMITTED BUT RELATIVELY SMALL. HOW IMPORTANT IS IT FOR YOU TO BE ABLE TO PERFORM LIVE, AND HOW EASY IS IT TO MAKE ENOUGH TO SUPPORT YOUR MUSIC AND YOURSELF?

The improvised music scene is wonderful, and full of some incredible musicians, committed audience members and tireless promoters, but with little funding, and most musicians have to diversify to get by. For me this is outside of music, including a decade as a special needs teacher which I found hugely rewarding, and more recently as a therapist, something which I love, and which has overlaps

with the here-and-nowness and deep listening of improvised music.

FINALLY CAN YOU LET US KNOW ABOUT ANY FUTURE PLANS TO PERFORM LIVE OR RELEASE NEW MATERIAL?

Olie Brice, Mark Sanders and I are releasing a new album, Immense Blue with some planned gigs in the UK and Europe. And I've got a few gigs coming up to promote the new album including at Klang Tone Records here in Stroud (yay!), Newcastle and Bristol. I'm also looking forward to a bit of a reflective period, working out what's next and getting to know the local music scene better.

Upstairs in Room 2 at the SVA Christmas Party is radiating top notch party vibes. The crowd - delighted putty in the hands of JOICEY DJs - are on a rollercoaster multigenre joyride that has everyone grinning wider, dancing wilder and whooping in unison to the end.

Catching a breather outside, one partygoer commented: "What I love most about these DJs is they'll do the mix and then rave along with the crowd having the absolute best time. That joy is so infectious."

I caught up with JOICEY DJs Amelie, Esther, Moina, Rosy, Ruby and Viv to discover the tribe behind the vibe, and what's at the heart of this latest creative collective to emerge from SVA...

TELL ME THE STORY OF HOW JOICEY CAME TO BE...

MOINA: When I was younger I loved collecting vinyl - finding old audio books to mix with soul tunes. We had regular DJ nights that were really fun, but hardly any other Womxn were DJing then. When I moved to London, I realised I'd been privileged to access those spaces and make fun mistakes with DJing. I started inviting friends who'd never DJ'd before to perform at SVA. For them it wasn't about mixing, just selecting great tunes - which gives an improvised, energised feeling that really comes from the heart. In 2019 I took a fantastic vinyl DJ course at Saffron's Mix Nights in Bristol. Saffron Records is inspirational, but it's mainly for over 18s in Bristol. Here, the majority of womxn interested in learning are younger and couldn't really access DJing due to not seeing themselves represented in the Stroud music scene. I realised we could work around some of those barriers. I've given informal 121 lessons for years but now we've arranged a 6-week group course with me and local DJ tutor Robbie Duncan.

WHAT IS THE ETHOS BEHIND JOICEY?

MOINA: It's foremost about playfulness and sharing music we love - keeping it fun every step of the way. If you dive straight into the tech it can be quite overwhelming and you lose the fun and the love. It's not really just about DJing either. It's also about people -especially women, trans and non-binary people's confidence, and organically passing on skills and support between peers. JOICEY is connected to SVA as a venue, so you can instantly start practising in a live context. We book DJs from London and Bristol, and local talent playing alongside these acts bring friends along to discover new artists and genres offering a holistic music education on the dancefloor!

WHAT KIND OF MUSIC DO YOU PLAY AND WHAT'S YOUR CONNECTION WITH MUSIC?

AMELIE: I began playing house and latin grooves, then fell in love with techno in Berlin. I play a mix of global beats (speed dembow and afro beats), high energy tunes that keep people moving, as well as some silly donk and techno! Sharing music has such power to connect - feeling at one with people around you, moving to the same beat.

RUBY: It's so eclectic! All of us playing together create a cool blend of sounds that people really enjoy.

ROSY: I started with some dubstep from my teenage years - then began exploring new sounds and figuring out what I'd like to play for others. I hadn't done that for a long time - actively seeking out new music.

ESTHER: The music we play is really diverse



- we're mixing all different genres. A lot of songs I play now, I heard when I was younger - from my dad, my mum, or friends.

VIV: I think my sound is quite housey - some people say disco. I like an awesome vocal from an old soul record and a great beat. My mum's really into disco, so she'll hear me play a track and say "Oh I remember when that came out" - it's nice having that connection through music.

MOINA: Some of the best tracks are ones I've heard with friends at a festival, club or in a tiny car. Playing them on the dancefloor creates this domino effect - adding more and more nostalgic memories to these amazing tunes. It's so powerful. People can tell when you have a special connection with a song.

RUBY: When you played Barry White at the end of your set Moina - I literally felt like I was flying. Like I was going to start crying. The whole room felt it!

TELL US A BIT ABOUT YOUR JOURNEY WITH JOICEY?

AMELIE: I used to play guitar and sing folk ballads at MouldJam, a weekly open mic night at SVA for

young people. I've got eclectic music taste though, and always loved dancing - watching DJs and thinking: "That looks so much fun, I'd love to share my music taste with a crowd." Now, in the year since I've started I've already been asked to play so many venues!

RUBY: I discovered JOICEY through Rosy and seeing friends doing it, like Amelie. I like the sense of female collaboration and being playful. It's not that serious, it's just like we're all playing music and having a dance.

ESTHER: My friend Saffron did it last year. I thought it was so cool that she was DJing her own music, so I asked her about it. I had a few sessions with Moina before the course started with Robbie.

VIV: It was a bit scary at first, learning new equipment, but Robbie took away the scariness, encouraging us to just play around and test it out. Now when we are all behind the decks together it feels really supportive.

ROSY: What a crazy journey in such a short time - I feel like the possibilities are endless!! It would be cool to play at a festival, but it's really about the feelings and the fun - let's

have more of that!

RATTLE AND BRASH



IT'S A DARK WET EVENING IN NOVEMBER. SINGER SONGWRITER MARA SIMPSON GENTLY PLAYS THE PIANO AS BETHANY STENNING PLUCKS A HARP AND VOKA GENTLE'S IMOGEN MASON INTERSPERSES WITH BLEEPS AND LOOPS. THE DRUMMER, JOOLS OWEN, PLAYS PERFECTLY WITH ONE HAND WHILE PLAYING A TRUMPET WITH ANOTHER. IT'S A MAGICAL MOMENT AND THE STROUD ARTS ESTABLISHMENT WATCHES ON, SILENTLY RAPT.

We are sitting in a repurposed barn at the end of Summer Street in Stroud. This is Rattle and Brash, a newly opened space designed for artists to come and experience, explore and create. It's the brainchild of Stroud residents Sarah Nicolls and Richard Kingdom who later tell me about their aspirations for the space.

Both have a background steeped in art. Sarah is a contemporary classical pianist who has increasingly

followed an experimental path. Having released an LP on legendary electronic label Warp she has, in recent years, focused heavily on playing 'inside' the piano. This has led her to developing an inside out piano which she played to great acclaim at last year's Hidden Notes Festival. Rich meanwhile was responsible for programming the Bluecoat Arts Centre in Liverpool during its year as European City of Culture in 2008 before working for the Arts Council. They moved to Stroud in 2020.

As soon as they saw a plot of land in Summer Street online they knew it was the basis of a project they had wanted to pursue for sometime. The local community had recently seen off an attempt by developers to build on the site, nestled in the Slad Valley so they knew that this was a special place. The site is 14 acres with 4 acres of woodland and a stream. It provided the big canvas they wanted to enable artists to explore their creative impulses. Taking inspiration from residencies Sarah had been on, in the Artangel Library of Water in Iceland and a writing residency at The Hurst Arvon Centre, they have built their home and the performance space.

The outcome is impressive, built largely from wood, the Rattle and Brash studio comfortably seats 30-40 people as well as providing space for performers. The first performer



to use the space was Lisa Fitzgibbon who created a song cycle inspired by the writing of Laurie Lee. She was followed by cellist-singer Sarah Smout and then, Mara Simpson who performed two sold out shows in November. There is a little more work to do to the building but the main space is now intact and ready for use.

As they themselves phrase it, they are currently in 'receiving mode', wanting to hear from artists who would be interested in using the space. They'd like Rattle and Brash to be a place artists of all disciplines come to do something that they might not be able to do elsewhere: new collaborations between artists from the Five Valleys and those from further afield, doing things at different scales, or taking deeper inspiration from the landscape. They want to experiment with running different types of residencies, some more structured, some less, and are interested to hear from experienced professional artists based in Stroud who could be interested in being artist mentors.

Sarah and Rich have a strong desire to share the space they have created and connect prospective artists with different cultural worlds. They have links to the Slad Valley Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, the Gloucestershire Wildlife Trust and local farming community as well as the artistic community and are keen that their collaborators also have opportunities to access these different interests through their work. They already host local schools once a year for DEFRA's educational visits programme and they are keen to further community engagement in the planting of more woodland.

There will be an Open Day on Sunday 25th February 2-4pm, where Rich and Sarah will be on hand to show people around. They are also planning something for Piano Day in March and other events, such as a regular Listening Hour and artists meet-ups, are in the pipeline. Sarah says that they love the idea of 'people meeting someone they would never have met, creating great art inspired by the land which goes on to really move and connect with people further afield.' This sounds like a great mantra and one we look forward to being fulfilled.

EXHIBITION SPACE: CHARLOTTE AIKEN

Step into the world of Elysian where Artist Charlotte Aiken urges a pause from our fast paced, digital world, inviting you to "stop and look up at the clouds." Abstract cloudscapes reveal her take on our vivid reality. Charlotte is set to captivate with her newest series of paintings, many of which are inspired by Rodborough Common's dramatic skies. In this collection, she delves into her fascination with clouds, whilst combining painting and music, using the space to create a sensory experience.

Recently relocated to Stroud and working from her studio at SVA, Charlotte Aiken's work celebrates the beauty of the sky and explores her intrigue with cloud formations, offering a perspective on our connection to nature. A 2017 graduate of the School of Art, Architecture, and Design in London, Charlotte, is represented by The Belgravia Gallery, ARTIQ, Cotswold Contemporary, and Ad Lib Gallery. In 2023, her painting was exhibited and sold in 'Only Connect,' The Royal Academy's Summer Exhibition.

Charlotte's paintings are informed by how she experiences the world, often feeling overwhelmed by how overexposed and pixelated life looks through her eyes. Her paintings are expressions of her surroundings and the colour scheme explores her emotions. Skies became an important interest to her during a period of challenging mental health, whilst living in London. Looking to the endless sky allowed her to escape how she was feeling and observe something bigger than humanity. Clouds gave her clarity and a reason to put brush to canvas to capture the uncapturable. 'Interruption', Charlotte's first series of skies, included electricity wires cutting across the canvas. The electricity wires often appearing in her work reference a feeling of being trapped and struggling to communicate with others. Since first pursuing her sky paintings in 2016, she has travelled across the world to photograph interesting cloudscapes and evoke an emotional response in herself.

In her new series of skies, she is exploring oil paint and mixed media, combining paint with metal leaf to add another depth to her compositions. Her love of colour, and



the versatility of oil paint lends itself well to the movement, layers, and texture Charlotte creates. More recently she began weathering copper plates to create a Verdigris to use as a background. The process of oxidising the plates interests Charlotte and the pattern created informs a starting point for the painting.

In addition to her personal artistic pursuits, Charlotte undertook training as an art teacher and worked at a Secondary school for two years. It was during a trip to Southern India in 2019, where she volunteered as an art facilitator for Sebs Schools, that Charlotte's passion for teaching was ignited. This experience inspired her to obtain the necessary qualifications, recognising the profound impact creativity can have on individuals. Particularly drawn to assisting those with educational needs, Charlotte found joy in helping students express themselves through art and build confidence. Upon relocating to Stroud, she made the bold decision to leave her school position and pursue her career as an artist whilst running classes and teaching students one-to-one.

One of Charlotte's recent achievements includes securing an artist residency with ARTIQ at The Pump House in Nottinghamshire. During this residency, she delved into the creation of her own paint pigments sourced from the local flora and rocks surrounding The Pump House. One of the highlights of her time there was utilising a Victorian letterpress to create a series of cloudscape lino prints, some of which will be featured in the upcoming exhibition.

SOMETHING A BIT SPECIAL HAPPENS AT THE PRINCE ALBERT **ON THE LAST WEDNESDAY EVENING OF EACH MONTH: IN THE COVERED COURTYARD A MOTLEY CREW CAN BE FOUND SINGING** THEIR HEARTS OUT, BANGING THE TABLES AND BRINGING FANTASTICALLY LOUD, BAWDY, **HEARTY (AND OCCASIONALLY MELANCHOLY) SEA SHANTIES TO** THE TOP OF RODBOROUGH HILL. **HOW DID THIS COME ABOUT? I MET THE PERSON WHO STARTED** IT ALL OFF HERE IN STROUD-**MUSICIAN, YOUTH-WORKER AND MUSIC SCHOLAR/STUDENT, DAISY BURT - TO FIND OUT...**

I started Shanty Bants in the summer of 2021. A young woman doing sea shanties might not be that easy in some pubs! Luckily, The Prince Albert is my local and I love how Lotte and Miles curate what goes on there - I felt I could try most things and everyone would be accepting and interested. So, I made a poster, gathered some people and gave it a go. And it's just_grown!

It was my own curiosity and wanting to learn more that prompted it - I'm not an expert in shanties at all. The songs aren't owned by anyone: music in general, but maybe especially folk, is something that we all have a right to harness in some way, without gatekeepers. There are barriers around musical learning that I wanted to avoid when I started Shanty's, so: we keep sheet music well out of the way and don't have too many lyric sheets because that leads us towards 'fixing the songs' and moving everyone into the same state of 'reading' rather than 'listening'. We keep the group open and as welcoming as possible to new people and importantly we keep it 'vocal only'. As much as I enjoy playing with other instruments, there is something

really special about the mix of twenty-or-so people acting as a supportive structure for a singer who has bravely started a song all on their own. All of those principles keep the fluidity and spontaneity of it, and the playfulness. That's what makes it!

Having studied from a particular aural tradition in Mali, where nothing was written down, but repeated over and over until I 'got it'; that's made me really appreciate the value of listening and interacting with music in an immersive way. It's almost child-like (despite the content of shanties, of course!) because it's an imitative practice, allowing each person to engage in whatever level of intensity they are looking for.

Some avid shanty singers will turn up to the session with various books of interest that contain lyrics and analyses. That's really useful, and brings depth to the group, but it's not at all a requirement. Others (like me, most of the time) will come empty-handed and benefit from the full immersive approach, sometimes looking particular songs up on their phones if they fancy. Many of the shanties we come across are in a versechorus style, and they often have a very characteristic call-and-response. This format allows space for anyone who instigates a new song, to lead, or 'call' the song, By one person simply singing it through, the group will start to join in (or respond) on the choruses.

Sea shanties are yes, songs of the sea, mostly written by men and sung by men - the common theme of the songs is debauchery! And fighting, and having no money and being lost at sea....the human condition basically. It's fiery, it's cathartic, the themes are hardships but there's also the element of 'Fuck it!' There's a defiance and strong physicality to it - lots of "hawling away' and 'heaving away'. There's a kind of heat to it, a lot of energy. I often lose my voice a bit towards the end. But it's worth it. At the end of the night I feel great quite tired, a bit hoarse, but buzzing! Shanty Bants is not a male-dominated group, which a lot of these groups are. Normally by around nine thirty/ten o clock, when we've all been singing for a while and had a few pints, it goes anywhere! So we sometimes change the words. One of my favourite shanties is an adaptation of the well-known Haul Away Jo that we sing regularly. Adapted between me and Rina Vergano, Haul Away Joan gives it a feminist angle. One of the verses goes:

When I was six I tried to fix the toxic patriarchy Away haul away, we'll haul away Joan I'd shout you cannot fix me lips because me lips belongs to me Away haul away, we'll haul away Joan

One of the things I like about 'folk' - which I took from my time in Mali, is that there are always infinite versions and interpretations to one song, depending on who you talk to/learn from/listen to. I got this sense that, independent from copyrights and academic authority, these songs have 'lives'. Shanty Bants is all about taking a broad attitude and being curious to different variations - that's what keeps it fresh and interesting.

I'd encourage everyone to come and give it a try. Just come and sit with us. You don't have to sing. You don't have to do anything, I think that's a really important part of what we all uphold - because it's not just me, it's the whole group that facilitates it. There are no pre-conditions, other than being a part of it and being kind. You don't have to do anything other than smile and enjoy it. What do we get out of it? Joy. Simply that - joy.

Shanty Bants takes place on Wednesdays, once a month at the Prince Albert. The February session will be held on Weds 28th from 8pm and is completely free to join. Visit **theprincealbertstroud.co.uk** for further info.
