





















IMMERSIVE FIELDS

I'M WAITING FOR JOHN'S AUDIO TO SYNC UP TO HIS VISIBLY MOVING MOUTH, THE DELAY IS SECONDS BUT DISTRACTING NONE-THE-LESS. IN AN IDEAL WORLD WE'D BE MEETING UP IN PERSON, BUT INSTEAD WE'VE OPTED TO HOLD THIS INTERVIEW OVER ZOOM, AS ALL THREE OF US ARE COVID CONVALESCENTS JUST EMERGING FROM THE BRAIN FOG.

We're here to discuss Immersive Fields, a unique audio/ visual spectacle originally slated for its debut in November but, y'know, Covid. The weekend-long festival is the brain-child of John Best, probably best known as the former manager of Sigur Rós, and sound designer David Sheppard whose CV includes work with Björk, Squarepusher and pretty much anyone else you consider sonically boundary-pushing. Immersive Fields lands at the Goods Shed this January and boasts a pleasingly broad and occasionally challenging bill of some of the UK's finest active musicians: From Cosmo Sheldrake's bird song duets, live performances by Luke Abbott and Richard Norris, pagan choral music from Gazelle Twin/NYX Choir and the cryptic pop of Laura Marling's group Lump and everything in between it seems, either performing live or pre-recorded using state-of-the-art immersive audio techniques (in layman's terms: many high end speakers surrounding the audience rather than your meat and potatoes two at the front set-up.)

WHAT WAS THE MOTIVATION BEHIND CREATING IMMERSIVE FIELDS?

David: John and I started on some ideas back before Covid hit where we wanted to explore new ways to present music to an audience that would be as viscerally exciting as being in front of a live band but might not necessarily have the band in the room. Working in the arts, I was becoming more and more conscious of the climate crisis and thinking of how we could avoid doing so much travelling, particularly with big ensembles: it's very hard to justify flying an hundred-odd musicians out to play to an hundred-odd people, it just started to feel wrong on many levels. We started to imagine a live event where it would be the musicians that you want to go and hear but, if they're not in the room, the music is presented in such a way that you wouldn't notice their absence. This led to thinking about the capabilities of immersive sound and how the technology has made this more feasible - especially as companies like d&b audiotechnik, who are based here, are delivering systems that can do this really, really well - we thought this could be the perfect showcase for what immersive audio can do. This technology allows you to really be inside the

John: There is this question of "why would I go to an event where the artist isn't?" To which I would say, we've got this culture now of seeing big acts in arenas or at festivals where essentially you're going to be spending that time watching a big telly with terrible sound in the company of others. What we're offering is an intimate relationship with the sound itself, much more of a deep listening experience.

WHAT CAN THE AUDIENCE EXPECT OVER THE WEEKEND?

J: Toward the end of my time managing Sigur Rós, we

experimented with a series of sound baths where we turned the lights off so you didn't have that visual focal point and the audience instead opted to lie down on the floor and just soak up the music. People loved it and that gave me confidence to think that a gig doesn't have to simply consist of staring at a stage for 90 minutes.

D: The music might be live, it could be performed in the room next door, or it might be pre-recorded, but the point is that it doesn't matter, it's about going to something that is all about being inside the experience. We're collaborating with Flat-e, a visual partnership I've worked with previously, who've been tasked with using visuals immersively in much the same way as the audio. Ultimately, the space will be a modular blank canvas for the audience to interact with as they choose.

D: Now that the technology has caught up, this approach will clearly affect how an artist approaches their music-making. A good example of this came from the band Black Country, New Road who trialled it recently. They immediately pointed out how, in a standard recording process, when two of their instruments are playing in the same tonal area you would lose the beauty of the individual instruments: they become one in a way that defeats the object of what they're trying to do. But the minute they spatially separate it, everything has its place.

J: While this isn't a new concept - there've been avantgarde artists doing this sort of thing for a long time - the tech now is frankly amazing and should be industry standard. Considering the possibilities it opens up, there's no excuse for this not to be implemented by any musician wanting to expand their sound. In a dream scenario we'd get someone like Flying Lotus using this format, I think he'd really push it to its limits and do some exciting things with it. Get it into his hands and the world's your oyster!

ANY PARTICULAR HIGHLIGHTS YOU WANT TO MENTION AHEAD OF THE FESTIVAL?

J: Gazelle Twin and the NYX Choir's Deep England project, which may be one of the more obscure things on the programme - a sort of post-Brexit, dark-Satanic-mills vibe runs through their music - it sounds so colossally good through this system, I can't wait to see the crowd's reaction. Deep England might be the blood red cousin to Hannah Peel's beautiful and optimistic Fir Wave, which will be played on the same night, it's a really nice pairing I think. I'm also hugely excited about seeing Matakoi live, a new project from Panda from Snapped Ankles/Toy in collaboration with filmmaker Daisy Dickinson - just wonderfully relentless motorik music.

D: Listening to the work Luke Abbott is putting together for this has been utterly fascinating, he's like version 2.0 of what this set-up can do. Where other artists may have offered us their stems to be mixed for 360° audio, Luke is creating music from scratch with this system in mind, he's well ahead of the game. His opening set will be something very special indeed.

EOSIN

IT WAS 2005 AND AFTER A DECADE OF WORKING AND PARTYING IN LONDON'S ELECTRONIC MUSIC SCENE. HUMPHREY BACCHUS WAS BURNT OUT AND TIRED OF MUSIC. HE TOOK OFF TO **BOULDER, COLORADO AND, SEEING THE IMPACT** OF MOVEMENT AND NUTRITION ON HEALTH. RETRAINED IN PHYSICAL THERAPY AND CLINICAL **NUTRITION. HE RETURNED TO OXFORD TWO** YEARS LATER LEAVING BEHIND THE MUSIC HE HAD CREATED PREVIOUSLY. THE YEARS PASSED BY, AND HUMPHREY FOCUSED ON CAREER AND **FAMILY BUT EVENTUALLY, FINALLY FEELING** REINVIGORATED AND UPON DISCOVERING THE EMERGING CONTEMPORARY CLASSICAL MOVEMENT, HE FOUND THE URGE TO CREATE **ONCE MORE...**

Humphrey's recent output under the moniker of Eosin is a departure from the dance-inspired music of his youth but is still housed within the electronic genre. Making use of both analogue synths and more traditional instrumentation, his brand new After The Silence EP fuses electronica with the contemporary classical sounds that so inspired him a decade ago. It's a chilled but uplifting experience and nicely whets the appetite for future projects solo and in collaboration.

The key starting point in this new material was contracting Covid in March 2020. Although he didn't get very ill himself, Humphrey did find himself dwelling on his own mortality. Asking himself what regrets he might have at the end of his life, he concluded that not making more music might be the thing that would irk him most. He set off on a period of unexpected creativity which has been as influenced by pop and britpop as much as it was by more obvious influences such

as Aphex Twin, Future Sound of London and Jeff Mills. Another key inspiration was visual artist James Victore, Humphrey saw him speak at an event where James said that "in order to find some gold you need to produce a lot of shit!". The phrase struck a chord and again stimulated Humphrey's creative urges to try new things.

His musical journey had begun as a teenager going to sound engineering college in London, before embarking on a Philosophy degree. During this time he contacted ex-Killing Joke member and super-producer Youth. Youth agreed to play at an electronic music event Humphrey was hosting and the two were soon DJing together at Brixton Academy. Humphrey eventually became Youth's label boss working and studio collaborator working with the likes of Alex Paterson from the Orb, Brother Culture and Russ Davies with whom he formed the act, Nada. He has no desire to return to the music industry per se, instead, he is happy to build the output of his newly launched label Slad Valley Records and the community that is growing around it. Key collaborators he is working with at the moment include Youth (who plays bass on a couple of the coming EP's tracks), Greg Hunter, Gez O'Connell (Ritual) and Argentinian singer Pilar Icazuriaga.

Although current releases are digital, Humphrey clearly has a desire to create in physical formats too. He decries the fact that it is difficult to thank collaborators on digital formats and accepts the fact that inevitably physical formats create something more long-lasting. Having seen the beautiful artwork for the EP developed by Good On Paper's very own Adam Hinks we can only hope this route is pursued!

For now, Humphrey is working towards an album – he's as happy making alt-pop as he is analogue driven electronica or ambient so we can't be sure exactly what this work will look like but if After The Silence is anything is to go by it is likely to be both emotive and reflective of Humphrey's new setting in the Slad Valley, having moved to the area about three years ago. As with many other musicians, Humphrey has found the area very inspiring to his work and hopes to reach out more in recent months to the burgeoning electronic

scene.



Coming from different musician backgrounds, Alexandra as a film composer and neoclassical artist, Mara as a songwriter and performer, the EP began where their sound worlds meet - with a



mutual love for field recording. In no time they had the idea to go walking together to capture whatever sounds came their way and bring them back into the studio.



JAMES RANDOLPH ROGERS

JAMES RANDOLPH ROGERS HAND-MAKES EXQUISITE WALLPAPERS BASED ON HISTORIC PATTERNS, HAND CARVED AND BLOCK PRINTED **ONTO CONSERVATION GRADE** PAPERS, USING MATERIALS AND **TECHNIQUES THAT ARE AUTHENTIC** TO THE 17TH AND 18TH CENTURY. **ROOTED IN HERITAGE AND CONSERVATION, THIS IS A PRACTICE OUT OF TIME, BUT, SCRUPULOUS AS JAMES IS IN HIS USE OF MATERIALS** AND ATTENTION TO THE DETAILS OF HISTORICAL PRODUCTION, THERE IS A CONTEMPORARY SENSIBILITY TO HIS WORK. CHARACTERISED BY A CERTAIN LIGHTNESS, SIMPLICITY AND ELEGANCE, JAMES'S WALLPAPERS COULD BE DESCRIBED AS TIMELESS.

It is late afternoon when I arrive at James's studio, which is located in one of the old mills at Brimscombe. The light is failing and, having felt my way up stone steps in the dark and stumbled through a heavy door, I am slightly surprised to find myself in a clear, spacious, well-lit room, divided by a series of staggered half walls. Some studios resolve themselves into order only when they are in use, tools and materials seem to be randomly scattered across workbenches until,

animated by the making process, it becomes clear that they are placed precisely to hand, exactly where they need to be.

James's studio, on the other hand, presents itself immediately as orderly and systematic. The walls that divide the room are papered or hung with samples of designs and colourways. The staggered walls have the effect of layering patterns, motif and colour. The richness of this effect is tempered by the tidiness and clarity of the space, which makes it feel coolly modern. There is a place for everything and everything is in its place. Plan chests contain sheets of base papers and finished wallpapers. Cupboards and open shelves store the ingredients for the distemper paints that he mixes himself using natural pigments suspended in a medium comprised of glue made from rabbit skin.

Printing blocks, carved by hand from fine-grained fruitwoods are neatly stowed. The printing is done on a cushioned table using a traditional oar press, which uses a wooden plate that is placed over the carved block and the base paper, with pressure applied across the surface by a lever improvised out of a length of scaffold pole - a simple but effective method. Printing multiple colours involves using several blocks - one for each colour. The blocks need to be carefully located in order to achieve a clear image. Similarly, repeated patterns require the precise placing of the block.

James prints in single sheets rather than the rolls that we have come to associate with wallpaper, which is historically accurate to the domino tradition in which he specialises. Base colours are applied to the paper by hand using a horsehair brush, which is how it was done in the 17th Century. The result is entirely

dependent on the skill of the maker. Although James aims to create an even, flat distribution of colour, very small variations in the density of tone are a trace of the handmadeness of the product and become a subtle part of its character. This is also true of the way that the printed colours register on the paper. The nature of the processes that James uses requires precision and control, so a clear workspace is essential, but the orderliness also seems to reflect his calm and considered personality, and perhaps a natural predisposition towards this kind of fine craftsmanship.

James originally trained as a fine art printer. He studied fine art and creative writing at Bath Spa University. At that time, etching was his favoured medium. A chance meeting led to him spending two years working as an assistant to Allyson McDermott, an international authority on the conservation and reproduction of historic wallpapers. It was with Allyson, working on the great houses of England, that he was able to develop the necessary skills of researching and making historic wallpapers, using traditional materials and techniques. The work was detailed and meticulous, analysing pigments, studying materials and colour matching. It was also with Allyson that he began to develop his proficiency in carving. James expresses a debt of gratitude to Allyson for passing on her knowledge and talking to him now, it is clear that through her he found a medium, a range of tools and a practice that he could work with and that he would find endlessly fascinating.

He subsequently moved to New York where he worked as an art handler for five years. At the same time, in a tiny flat in Queens, he continued to devote himself to researching patterns and carving blocks for printing.

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Alongside this traditional craft he made large abstract drawings that are an on-going part of his fine art practice. These drawings involve continuous looping lines that are layered into dense shading, with random shapes picked out and left as clear white paper. These shapes seem to float over the compressed darkness of the background. The effect is absorbing, introspective. Although they express a completely contrasting aesthetic and approach to making, they seem to relate to the wallpapers through the use of repetition and the way that forms emerge out of complexity.

Now James is permanently settled back in Rodborough, near to where his family are based and where he grew up. He has created his workshop and is building up a client base for both his specialist conservation work and his original wallpaper designs. He is represented by an agent in the United States and some of his biggest commissions have been over there. In the meantime, he supplements his wallpaper making with dry-stone walling, a less fastidiously clean practice, but one that demands a similar approach to precision and correctness.

Although James's wallpaper is authentically rooted in traditional practices and based on historic patterns, it is also original. It does not fetishize the past and, as already noted, it seems distinctly modern, in the use of colour and in the geometric simplicity of the repeated patterns. He brings a huge amount of knowledge to this work, slowly acquired through learning and practice over many years, but he also brings his understanding as an artist with a contemporary eye. It is always a pleasure to encounter expertise – married to enthusiasm. I would describe James as an expert in his field.

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EXHIBITION SPACE

SHOES HAVE NAMES

NEW BREWERY ARTS IS EXCITED TO ANNOUNCE A NEW EXHIBITION. SHOES HAVE NAMES, A COLLABORATION WITH CONCEPTUAL FASHION DESIGNER JO COPE AND SHELTER. STORIES OF HOMELESSNESS HAVE NEVER BEEN TOLD LIKE THIS BEFORE.

Ten international artists, shoemakers and designers were paired up with a formerly homeless person that Shelter has helped through its frontline services. The show features a collection of handmade artworks inspired by the personal experiences of real people facing homelessness. From shoes made out of an old sofa, to the use of the latest CAD software and 3D printing.

The show was originally put on at Shelter's flagship Boutique Shop in Coal Drop Yard, London as part of the 2020 London Craft Week. The show comes to New Brewery Arts highlighting two areas close to the organisation's values – the beautifully crafted shoes by renowned artists speak to the centre's high-quality craft values. In 2020 during the COVID-19 Pandemic New Brewery Arts opened its Barrel Store accommodation to homeless people in need, this exhibition resonates and helps to remind us that homelessness has many 'looks' and exists in Cirencester, it speaks to New Brewery Arts values of working with and supporting our local communities.

The exhibition aims to raise awareness of the thousands of people tackling evictions, poor housing conditions, landlord issues and homelessness. But Shelter gives hope. With the right support and by working together, people can fight bad housing and make a positive change. The exhibition is also working towards removing a stigma around homelessness. These very personal examples of a homeless experience highlight the many 'faces' of homelessness, and the reality of the issue being so close to home.

Each shoe or pair of shoes created by the designers are named after the person who's been supported by Shelter. The designers have been asked to create a unique design reflecting the stories of the individuals using the materials they are most comfortable using from their current design specialisms.

The show has a dominating/striking red aesthetic- Jo Cope explains;

"THERE IS AN EMERGENCY, THERE IS A HOUSING CRISIS, IT IS A CALL TO ACTION, THAT IS WHAT THE RED IS ABOUT".

Beth Alden CEO New Brewery Arts said: "We're all about craft and its role in society. Shoes Have Names uses creativity and craft skills to expose the stigma of homelessness and hopefully, start some meaningful, positive conversations that foster a better community."

Jo Cope, artist and exhibition producer, said: "Shoes Have Names aims to use fashion as a positive vehicle to create greater public awareness of homelessness. It also celebrates the amazing work of Shelter. This year, as the pandemic took hold and more and more people found themselves facing their own housing crisis, Shelter's services have never been more vital. I believe fashion can play an evolving role in society. This project uses shoes as an empathetic vessel, bringing together a highly talented community of designers to create shoes which tell real life stories of people who have faced homelessness. Fashion's role in society is changing; this fashion project reflects the need for ethical shifts in the fashion industry towards something more human-centred. Naming shoes after real people supported by Shelter is a way of giving these people back their place in society and a positive identity, which can sometimes be lost by the blanket term 'homeless'."

The exhibition opens on the 29th January and runs until Sunday 3rd April. Contributing artists include: Kobi Levi, Elisabeth Thorsen, Kristina Walsh, Liz Ciokajlo, Tabitha Ringwood, Daniel Charkow, Dr Ellen Sampson, Caroline Groves, Jana Zornik and Jackie Leggett.
