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

TOM RAVENSCROFT

GOING INTO THE FAMILY BUSINESS ISN'T FOR EVERYONE, BUT FOR TOM RAVENSCROFT IT'S TURNING OUT PRETTY WELL. WITH A REGULAR SHOW ON BBC 6 MUSIC, DJ GIGS ACROSS THE COUNTRY AND A REPUTATION AS ONE OF THE NATION'S TASTEMAKERS, HIS PROFILE HAS RISEN SIGNIFICANTLY IN A SHORT TIME.

It wasn't always this way. At the start of his career Tom worked in TV, digitising footage. Despite being the son of DJ national treasure John Peel, working in radio never really occurred to him. With the sudden death of his father in 2004, he found himself pulled increasingly towards musical projects culminating in an ongoing relationship with 6 Music starting in 2010.

Tom only sporadically broadcasts on daytime radio. It is on the outer fringes that he is happiest playing everything from afro disco to esoteric folk. It is on evening shows that the selector can play exactly the tracks they want people to hear, and Tom has a loyal audience that expects the unexpected. "I'm not very good at hiding my discontent for music I don't like" he tells me, so the evening slots and filling in for the likes of Gilles Peterson suits him just fine. Amongst his recent discoveries are Koma Saxo and Sofia Jernberg on Helsinki based label We Jazz and the new record by Nick Leon, a Miami based hip hop and electronica producer. Tom has described himself as a 'hunter-gatherer' in his desire to search out new and exciting sounds, something many of us crate diggers can relate to.

Tom is clearly a guy who wants to do things on his own terms, and this has also led to another new avenue in his life with a move to the countryside. Like many during lockdown, he and his wife reassessed their priorities in light of a young family and decided they would like to have a rural base. Key criteria being "somewhere nice that isn't horribly rightwing" led him inevitably towards Stroud. A short stay in the Slad valley, and a visit to the Woolpack and Sound Records later, they had put an offer in on a property and they became resident in 2021

It has taken Tom some time to get a turntable set up in the new house but I'm pleased to report that this hasn't prevented him picking up vinyl on his trips back to the shire. A number of his purchases subsequently getting played to the nation who have surely benefited from hearing Japanese surf guitar and other such delights.

While Tom's musical palette is varied, there are undoubtedly some particular areas of interest. He had a penchant for both highlife and drum n bass in his youth and sounds from these genres still resonate today in both his radio shows and his DJ sets. Which of the two formats does he prefer I wonder? "I love the two-way interaction of radio" he says " it's a chat between you and lots of people." Live DJing has its pleasures too "It feels so liberating hearing music loud and getting sweaty with people" he enthuses.

This bodes well for the upcoming Good on Paper Party this month at which Tom is playing the headline set at the Sub Rooms stage. What can we expect, I ask? "I have a slight tendency for going a bit hard a bit early" he admits, "The temptation will be to go really wild – I'll be ready!" Fighting talk indeed, I hope you are ready Stroud, it's going to be quite a night....

EMERGING THROUGH THE MILKY STRATUS, TREES SOLIDIFY THEMSELVES AGAINST THE CLOSE SKY, EVERGREEN YET BARELY SEEN. THIRTY SECONDS OF RISING TONES **PULL TENSION TO THE BRANCHES BEFORE TUMBLING TOGETHER AS THE BEAT STARTS, SOME DISTANT SOUNDS** REMINISCENT OF INSECT CHATTER. THE MOUNTAINS TURN INTO THE HARD FLANKS OF A USED QUARRY, PALE RIDGES RIVULOSE AND WANDERING. MAINTAINED BY THE MUSIC WE ARE **CARRIED INTO A CRESCENDO OF** DANCE, DUST KICKED TO THE SKY, FINGERS DIGGING DEEP, MOUTH TO THE EARTH. ARE YOU ENTRANCED? **CAN YOU TASTE THE DIRT?**

The music video for Blind Summit, ASTRYD's debut EP, is a collaboration between them, the filmmaker Elisa Cucinelli, and the dancer Justin Thomas-Smith. Despite the dance being choreographed and filmed in an abandoned building lot in Berlin, and the rest in an Austrian open-mine, the flawless editing seamlessly merges the two. The effect is impressive, the viewer held somewhere between the contemporary electronic music and the unidentifiable, yet unmistakably, European natural landscape.

ASTRYD is made up of the brother duo Jo and Tomàš Kaspar, who have been creating music together since their teens. Their first entry into the electronic music scene came through Glastonbury festival, and exploring Berlin's club nights introduced them to techno and dance music. After some time in separate bands and the creation of a queer friendly experimental club night that evolved into a record label, Dialogue, they came back together to explore their unique "musical dynamic" and they've now been working together creatively as ASTRYD for over four years. This initially began

by improvising long live songs, the process of which has remained an inherent part of song-writing for them, as they've "shaped and explored [their] sound in direct relation to performing in club spaces", and seeing how people respond. When live, a single track could be as long as an hour, feeding off itself, each other, and the crowd. A dialogue in its own right.

A large incentive behind the creation of Dialogue, club nights started 5 years ago by Jo and his "close friend and fellow Stroudy Joe Craven", was inclusivity in all its forms. From booking predominantly BAME and queer artists, to accessibility requirements, unisex toilets, and a zero-tolerance policy to harassment, the emphasis is on safety and enjoyment. Dialogue is about partying collectively in the best way possible, to good music: collective effervescence under the banner of carefully curated techno. Staving true to the precedent, there are currently plans in the works for a Dialogue residency programme based in London and aimed at helping young BAME producers from Lewisham Burrough to access space and equipment. Despite being separate projects. ASTRYD has developed alongside Dialogue, with the duo DJing and hosting club nights in Berlin, Cezch Republic, Manchester, London and Bristol, and the effects of working in such vibrant musical environs can only have influenced their music for the better. With Tomàš's time spent living in Berlin in 2021, performing ambient music and "exploring some of the slower, more sound design elements that feature in... ASTRYD", and Jo set to live in Japan for three months in 2022, their outlook is global and brings with it exciting opportunities to collaborate abroad and share their passion for the music they love.

ASTRYD's most recent release is a reimagining of their debut EP: "inviting friends and artists that have inspired [ASTRYD's] music to remix Blind Summit felt like a natural step in the evolution on Dialogue", they say. Blind Summit REWORKED is Bristol-focused, and enables a conversation within the community to take

place through music as artists interpret each track differently, leading them down new paths. Artists they have invited to take part include El Hardwick, Delay Grounds, and - for the lead single, Numbing - Machine Woman. ASTRYD became friends with Machine Woman after she did a set at Dialogue a couple years ago. "Dialogue has been an amazing platform for booking (and getting to watch) sets from loads of artists we love," ASTRYD say, "All of this has had a big effect on our sound." Dialogue has only recently developed as a label, and they would like to push it out into releasing more music by other exciting artists. Listening to Blind Summit REWORKED was a mesmerising experience and, for me, enhanced by having listened to the Blind Summit EP only moments before as the songs merge in and out, one after the other, effortlessly. Hearing how the tracks had changed into something nearly unrecognisable, yet catching the original flowing constantly through it all kept drawing me back in to notice new things. As if overhearing a conversation between two people where you focus in on one or the other's voice, distantly engaged.

Their newest ASTRYD EP has already been completed, a period of isolation in December helping them to "get lost in the making", and they're excited to share the new "development and direction of [their] sound". Unfortunately for fans, it will not be released until much later in 2022. However, tracks and remixes will continue to be released through Dialogue, to tie us over. Even sooner, for those whose interest has been sufficiently piqued by the sound of electronic music and great partying, they will be performing at the Good On Paper Party Vol.6 stage at Ulter on Saturday the 5th of February .

ELVIS MCGONAGALL

Stand-up poet, comedian and broadcaster, armchair revolutionary and walking shortbread tin, Elvis McGonagall resides at The Graceland Caravan Park somewhere in the back of beyond where he scribbles satirical verse whilst drinking malt whisky and listening to Johnny Cash. A deftly witty wordsmith, sharp and subversive but not afraid to be plain daft, Elvis has been spitting his scurrilous diatribes against the powers that be since 2003. And look at the state of the world now. So that's 18 years of futile ranting.



EDWARD TRIPP

Edward Tripp is a stand-up poet, writer and visual artist, living in Devon. Edward has previously brought his unique brand of spoken-word to nights and festivals such as Spork! Poetic License and WOMAD. Once described as a cross between Dave Allen and David Lynch, Tripp squashes the surreal with the sincere, making work that's funny, deeply strange and often a little depraved.



JONNY FLUFFYPUNK

A regular fixture at the Good On Paper Party and the curator and host of the spoken word/comedy stage at the church Jonny Fluffypunk is an economic refugee from the home counties, who began his 'career' spitting vicious political verse between bands at punk gigs until cured by a West Country shaman. Now he 'does' poetry that deafly fuses bittersweet autobiography, political disillusionment and surreal whimsy in an act which has established him as a firm favourite at festivals, arts centres and housing benefit offices up and down the country.



ED ACZEL

Ed Aczel is a British stand-up comedian who is notorious on the scene for his unique style of comedy, or 'anti-comedy'. Managing to balance performing critically acclaimed shows in his spare time away from his job as a project manager for a marketing company in Aylesbury, Ed weaves skills from his daily life seamlessly into his shows. Using SWOT analysis, holding political Q&A sessions and very cleverly utilising silence to divide and conquer his audiences, Ed is now a seasoned comic performing regularly at the Fringe and beyond.



CLARE FERGUSON-WALKER

A sculptor, painter, singer, mother and poet, Clare Ferguson-Walker has been trying not to fall asleep at the wheel on the M4 as she roams around the country talking at people, making them laugh, groan and cry, though not necessarily in that order. As a performance poet she has been described as hilarious, crude, thought provoking and once as awful by a drunken heckler.



ODIOUS VEX

Spend some time in the company of Swindon's number one poet, rapper part time car washer and Paintballer-Odious Vex. He's living proof that just because you want to write poetry, it doesn't mean you should. He'll be explaining why drugs are bad, war is bad, and sexism is bad- and that's bad in a bad bad way and not a good bad way. His 17- year old wisdom of the world includes clumsy rhymes, contrived metaphors and A level Sociology political insight from his 1-hour show An Arts Council Grant Don't Come for Free (Be a Poet or Die Trying)



WOBBIE WOBBIT

Wobbie Wobbit is a comic songwriter and performer with a wonderful and joyous ability to engage any audience within the first ten seconds. She has played to thousands at festivals (including the Cabaret Stage at Glastonbury) and is equally at home in intimate club venues, theatres and parties. Her songs are funny and quirky and delivered with a mischievous self knowledge that underlies a unique intelligence and ironic vision.

SOHRAB KAVIR

This is the agonising trajectory of filmmaker Sohrab Kavir in his 20-year bid to produce his self-funded, award-winning feature documentary, The Duchenne Boys; a personal narrative of survivor's guilt and the search for meaning, after the deaths of three of his brothers in Iran, from Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy.

It is also the triumphant trajectory of a man who refused to give up, and for whom the act of making this film was both a catharsis and a campaign for change.

If you have heard of Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy, it probably means you are personally affected by it. A little known, severe, progressive, muscle-wasting disease, Duchenne leads to difficulties with movement and, eventually, to the need for assisted ventilation and premature death. It is hereditary, and most common in boys, and it can take hold from the age of three. And if you live in Iran, it is also hugely misunderstood, leaving sufferers and their

carers without the medical and social assistance needed to ease the ravaging effects this disease inflicts upon its young hosts

This was Sohrab's boyhood in Iran, in a family of modest means, watching helplessly as his brothers succumbed to Duchenne. So little was known about it, that Sohrab's parents thought their sons suffered from polio. "When my little brother died, I was about 19. I was in shock. I hated myself. I hated the world. I was lost. I didn't know it at the time, but I was looking for meaning," says Sohrab. "I started watching films, and I came across the James Dean movie East of Eden. In that moment, I knew I wanted to be a fillmmaker. And in that moment, I decided I needed to make a film about my brother. I didn't want my brother to have died in vain. In a way, I became a filmmaker to make this film."

To say Sohrab is determined is somewhat of an understatement, as the prologue to this article testifies. In 2003, he used a smuggler to help him escape Iran, and took his chances with UK immigration. He learned English and studied film production at London South Bank University. He now has UK citizenship and runs a production and marketing business, living in Stroud with his wife and baby daughter. He attributes much of his determination to the strategies he acquired to cope with ADHD and dyslexia, conditions that he says were also overlooked in Iran.

Early in the film's development, in the mid noughties, Sohrab struck upon a brilliant filmic conceit. He would form a national virtual football team of Duchenne sufferers, with bespoke avatars, to play an online football match against a similar team from the UK. "You have to understand that football is really important to Iranian kids. But with



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Duchenne, the legs go first. And if they can't use their legs, they use their imaginations," say Sohrab. Most sufferers retain the use of the hands for longer, and so many create table football games. He continues: "My brother and I used marbles. Another of the kids in the film made a game from ice cream sticks."

Sohrab wanted to get as many Duchenne sufferers as possible connected to computers, and to the Internet, to improve their quality of life. His virtual football team was the perfect vehicle, both for his campaign and his film. "The idea that these boys would be playing football via a computer using their personalised avatars was massive for me," he says.

In 2010 Sohrab paid fines of around £5,000 to the Iranian government for his evasion of National Service and illegal border crossing seven years earlier, and he returned to Iran to make his film. He met hundreds of families in his quest to form the football team. Without a database for Duchenne sufferers this was painstaking work that relied on word-of-mouth testimony and extensive travel. The boys' stories are illuminating. Several of their fathers are wracked with guilt in the belief that they must have offended God to cause him to strike down their sons. One, a former mullah, became a drug addict, so great is his despair. Many of the boys have become accomplished chess players, one of the few outlets for their broken bodies and smart minds. Few complain.

Sohrab returned to the UK to start the edit with





130 hours of footage. Unsurprisingly, he hit a creative block, but managed to cut a short film and submitted it to London Film School earning him a bursary to start a Masters degree in film. But like all compelling three act narratives, Sohrab's life story has its own second act nadir. As does his film.

During his studies, Sohrab received news that one of his Duchenne team players had died. "I became numb. I couldn't finish my work. I was lost. I wanted to stay numb" he says, referring to his descent into addiction. More of his boys died, as did Sohrab's hope. Eventually, he sought help from the 12 Step Programme. "This film would not have happened without the 12 Step Programme. It taught me humility, and I understood that if I was going to complete the film, I had to share all my story."

Sohrab finished his Masters and approached the acclaimed Iranian film editor Hayedeh Safiyari. "I was amazed, when she agreed to edit the film," exclaims Sohrab. By now, Sohrab's entire teenage football team had died. Just like Sohrab himself, his film could so easily have succumbed to this unbearable tragedy. It took Hayedeh and Sohrab almost a year to re-cut the film, in between other projects, Sohrab raising funds where he could.

It's hard to imagine how a storyteller can restore hope after this unspeakably sad turn of events, but strangely Sohrab does. His admission in the film of his own downfall and recovery infuses his story with enormous humanity, notably when he returns to the father with addiction, more empathetic than his previous visit.

Sohrab and his film have been intertwined for more than 20 years. Although the film has won eight international film awards, he is still looking for a distributor. In the meantime, he has launched Duchenne Boys as an online social campaign to raise awareness. His sister now runs a Duchenne charity in Iran. And Sohrab has teamed up with filmmaker Robyn Pete. Together they are working on a new film, "We are looking for a cure," says Sohrab, with customary resilience.

Duchenne Boys is a triumph of perseverance. It is at times difficult to watch. As it should be. Eleven boys died in its making. We owe it to them to give this honest and raw film the attention it deserves.



Duchenne Boys was recently screened at Atelier presented in collaboration with the Stroud Film Festival which returns next month. 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DOWN IN THE VALLEY

"HAVE YOU EVER TRIED APPLYING FOR ARTS COUNCIL FUNDING?" **CAN'T SAY I HAVE. "IT'S QUITE** AN INTERESTING UNDERTAKING." LISA FITZGIBBON IS EXPLAINING HOW THE PROJECT DOWN IN THE **VALLEY ORIGINATED AND HOW IT GOT ITS ARTS COUNCIL FUNDING. IT** HAPPENED DURING LOCKDOWN. IT WAS HER FIRST EVER APPLICATION FOR FUNDING, AND SHE WON IT. "I JUST FELL IN LOVE WITH THE **VALLEY. WE WALKED IN THE VALLEY NEARLY EVERY DAY." THIS IS THE** SLAD VALLEY. LISA AND HUSBAND LEE MOVED TO STROUD FROM **OXFORDSHIRE THREE YEARS AGO. JUST A FEW MONTHS TO GET TO** KNOW THE PLACE, OF COURSE, AND THEN LOCKDOWN. "IT WAS THE THING THAT SAVED US FROM BEING **LOCKED IN OUR HOUSES AND THE** TORMENT OF NOT KNOWING WHAT WAS HAPPENING TO THE WORLD. AND THAT REALLY INSPIRED ME TO WRITE THESE SONGS."

Lisa is a songwriter, professional musician, producer and facilitator. "I have a natural interest in writing songs about historic situations and things that have happened in the past." She wrote a song for the Oxford Canals Trust that explores the story of the 1895 freeze, when the canals were frozen for twelve weeks, over Christmas. Then there was the story of the Cataraqui, the ship wrecked off the Bass Strait. Where's that? It's the bit in between Tasmania and Oz. The ship carried twenty-one citizens from the Oxfordshire village of Tackley, put on board because it was cheaper to send them to Australia than it was to keep them at "the poor rate" here, cue for a song.

Lisa did the opposite journey (not by ship). "I arrived in London with 50 quid in my pocket and I spent that on the taxi from Heathrow to Stoke Newington." Rookie mistake. Lisa was brought up in the outback of Australia in Cobar, New South Wales, well into the red centre about 20 hours north west of Sydney. Her childhood was Cobar and the Macquarie Valley and then to college in Lismore on the North coast "They had quite a progressive contemporary music college there so I studied voice, and then I moved to Sydney and then one day I just decided I was going to go to London."

A taxi ride, a few bar jobs in Islington and some music later she moved into a house in Berkshire owned by Ian Gibson, the accountant for Real World Studios, so she was there at the beginnings of WOMAD Festival. Music, she says, had chosen her. "I went on to record and release five albums, founded my own band and did a lot of touring, throughout Europe, Asia and Australia, That was in the days when you could still stick all your life in the back of a car, drive somewhere, play a gig, sell loads of CDs and make a living out of it. I did that for fifteen years." She's played the mainstage at Glastonbury, managed and toured with Chris Difford from Squeeze. But then, around 2010, the arts centers that used to pay people to play their venues, got less keen on that idea. Festivals began to suggest that it was a "privilege" to play their event, so the touring lifestyle was over.

The website Down in Valley uses Lisa's talent and experience to showcase new songs, the story behind them and the process of writing them. "I wanted the project to be about the process rather than all about the product." On the website Lisa takes you through the valley, and the stories of the songs she is writing and singing with the focus on Laurie Lee's Cider with Rosie. Alongside that is the community event, the Stroud Songwriters' Circle which takes place in the Laurie Lee bar at The Woolpack on the first Sunday of every month. "If there are any songwriters out there that want to come to the Songwriters' Circle, it's just a wonderfully supportive space for people who are starting songwriting, or people who have been writing for a long time and just to want to try a new song and get constructive feedback and discuss the process." Lisa has conducted workshops at MusicWorks in Gloucester, which offers excellent facilities and support to aspiring young musicians who may otherwise struggle for access. "I went there and did three workshops similar to the pro7ect" the professional songwriting events that Lisa curates. "We did a proper collaborative write, record and mix of a song in a day."

Lisa has finished six songs in the cycle, three are on the website more will be uploaded soon. There's a murder ballad, one about the Woolpack and there's the story of the death of Florence Tuck (known as Miss Flynn in Cider with Rosie) plus a song about the arguing grannies. Lisa got access to Laurie Lee's old neighbour's house, where the grannies lived and was able to explore and inspire, finishing with a song session in the garden "it just felt like it was meant to happen..."

The last song in the cycle, is called Rosie's Reply, and is a collaboration with Stroud poet Adam Horovitz; "I thought I don't want to put anyone's nose out here, I'm Australian, I've only lived in Stroud for three years and for me to put words in Rosie's mouth in a reply to Laurie Lee's account in the book, felt a bit uncomfortable." But Adam, who grew up in Slad credits his writing, partly to Laurie Lee's mentoring. He was enthusiastic about the project and so they wrote Rosie's Reply together, which gives the character of Rosie her say in what happened under that cart. "I'm really, really pleased with it. It's kind of different to the other songs in the cycle, but it feels really powerful to sing. The words are mostly Adam's ... I wrote the music and the melodies, and we tightened it up together. It reads really well as a poem in itself and it kind of gives her some power back." The story, the song and the research process will be on the website soon and part of the process is performance. "We're going to have a concert at a farm just down the road here in the Slad Valley (May 31st) to celebrate to the 25th anniversary of the passing of Laurie Lee." Lisa and her band the Powerfolk Quartet will perform the song cycle, so put the date in your diary, more dates and venues will be announced in the Spring.
