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
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THEIR NEW ALBUM MAY ONLY BE THEIR THIRD AS FADER, BUT NEIL ARTHUR AND BEN EDWARDS, AKA BENGE, HAVE A COLLECTED CV SPANNING DECADES, CONSISTING OF SOME OF ELECTRONIC MUSIC'S MOST **CUTTING EDGE ACTS. BE IT ARTHUR'S WORK WITH BLANCMANGE AND NEAR FUTURE OR BENGE'S WITH** JOHN FOXX AND THE MATHS AND GAZELLE TWIN (WHOSE RECENT IMMERSIVE FIELDS PLAYBACK AT THE GOODS SHED IN STROUD DEMONSTRATED D&B AUDIOTECHNIK'S 360° SYSTEM AT ITS FINEST), THE PAIR HAVE MORE THAN EARNED THEIR RESPECTIVE STRIPES, IT'S THAT PEDIGREE AND EXPERIENCE THAT HAS BROUGHT FORTH QUARTZ; TEN TRACKS OF SWEEPING AND TEXTURAL ELECTRONICA. SHOT THROUGH WITH EXPERT SOUND DESIGN AND **AUTHORITATIVE SONGWRITING.**



From the Boards Of Canada-reminiscent dark melodies of 'Porcelain' to the fragmented breakbeat stylings of 'Gargoyle' and the Vienna-era Ultravox redolence of 'Manilla', Quartz is an explorative album that effortlessly holds abstraction and accessibility in tension. Old, found tracks are sampled, '80s and '90s TV themes are cited as influences and shimmering reverbs tail off into a dreamlike space. While the album, like Fader's debut First Light, was largely recorded and mixed at Benge's MemeTune Studios, Arthur crafted his lyrics and vocals from his home studio in Rodborough.

"The first album we did together, Benge actually wrote all the music when he was living in Los Angeles," explains Neil. "We met shortly after he came back to England because we share the same manager. And fortunately, we both got on! He sent me some music over, just some ideas that he'd worked on, and I was really inspired by them. It was quite a nice position for me to be in, because I didn't have to write the music! Normally, I'm used to writing a lot of music, and here I didn't have to do that. I was given all these beautiful synth sounds and structures and things. Every so often I will put some sound effect on, you know, just a little bit of embellishment here and there. But it's negligible. And that kind of set a tone for how we work together now."

With the pair also working together as part of the Arthur-spearheaded project Blancmange, this workflow represented something of an inversion of the norm. "Am I officially in Blancmange? I don't know!" laughs Benge ("You're an honorary member..." jokes Neil, "probably more than me!"). "With Blancmange, Neil will work on the songs and then bring them to me to replace bits and embellish them," Benge continues. "With Fader it's the opposite way round. I write the backing tracks first, with no idea for lyrics, and then send them to Neil as little tracks that are quite developed. He will then work on lyrics and vocal parts on his own, and then send them back to me. Then we finish it off after that.'

"I feel they're a lot more than that," Neil protests. "They're not just backing tracks, they're really beautiful, structured pieces of music! The fundamental difference is that Ben starts Fader and I start Blancmange. And because, obviously, we're very different people, it comes with different information, that very embryonic part of it sets the tone, I feel. I think, without knowing it, we've refined a way of working which will hopefully suit us not just for the next album, but beyond that. We've got a formula. What's the word...it's lean. That's what it is."

Can I find the way? / Can I find The words? / Is this a trap that we're walking into? / Is this a door back into Olympia? muses Neil on 'Olympia'. The lyrics on Quartz are abstract and at times oblique. As he points out, "there's only one track on the whole album that actually relates to something in this world, an event that took place." Dreamlike and dark, they dive just below the surface of the subconscious— but the origins of these poetic journeys and their accompanying titles are almost humorously banal.

"Benge sent all the songs through, and each one of them had a title," explains Neil. "He and his partner were redecorating their house during lockdown, and they happened to have a colour chart for the paint colours. So, for want of a better thing, Benge just chose titles at random from the names of these paints and sent them through to me! I took all these titles that he sent with the music and used them as inspiration for lyrics. So each one of them; 'Porcelain', 'Quartz', 'Manilla', 'Poison'... they all sent me on a journey to create a lyrical poem that went with the music. I'd never done that before, so that was quite an exciting adventure for me."

laughs Benge. "Because, everything is all generally named after the synth I made it on. It can get kind of confusing."

Despite their wide range of musical exploits, the music of Fader occupies a clear niche in both its members' catalogues. "I do music all the time," says Benge. "Little bits and bobs on my own, just making things. But I know when a track is a Fader track—before Neil's even heard it. It has a sort of melodic logic to it that is different to some of the other stuff I do. The first album, which I did in LA, was infused with lots of '80s Hollywood soundtrack-y sort of stuff. For this last album, I was getting much more into vaporwave sounds, '90s sounds."

A Stroud resident since 2007. Neil continues to be impressed and encouraged by the town's musical culture and output. "It punches way above its weight," he says. "I've heard a lot of electronic music in Stroud. I've also heard a lot of music coming out of venues that isn't electronic! There's some bloody great stuff. I've been to see lots of different parts of festivals, walked into somewhere and seen people experimenting with Eurorack modular synths, or people kind of getting off on minimal beats... It's quite surprising! There's some great stuff going on. You go into a church and see something avant garde mixed with electronics, and then you can walk out and buy half a pound of potatoes!"

IT'S FAIR TO SAY THAT STROUD IS A PRETTY BROAD MUSICAL CHURCH, WHETHER YOUR THING IS ACID FOLK OR UK GARAGE YOU'RE LIKELY TO FIND SOMETHING TO TICKLE YOUR FANCY. BLACK METAL HOWEVER IS PROBABLY A GENRE THAT HASN'T REALLY HAD ITS MOMENT IN THE SUN... UNTIL NOW.

It's a little known fact but the Five Valleys actually hosts the largest Black and Extreme Metal publishing outlet in Europe. Cult Never Dies relocated here in 2018 and has published 23 books to date on the likes of Mortiis, Rotting Christ and Moonspell.

So, what is Black Metal I ask Cult Never Dies owner Dayal Patterson? "Essentially it's extremely heavy music," he tells me "but whereas the end point for Death Metal is aggression, Black Metal focusses on atmosphere and often incorporates other elements that aren't pure aggression-maybe a progressive, folk or classical element, for example." Bigger proponents of the genre are Mayhem, Cradle of Filth, Bathory and Darkthrone.

It's been a long and winding road for Dayal to get to this point. Temporarily dropping out of school in Surrey at 14 he hung out in record shops listening to the likes of Paradise Lost (who provide the focus of the imprint's next publication), Pantera and Sepultura before entering the realm of extreme metal via the likes of Carcass and Bolt Thrower. At the age of 20 he moved to London, picking up jobs taking photos and designing logos for bands, before developing his own fanzine Crypt. He sent the zine onto key publication Metal Hammer for a review, instead they offered him a job.

For the next decade he worked at the forefront of Metal journalism, interviewing the likes of Alice Cooper,

Rammstein, Megadeth and Tony Iommi as well as legends from other genres including Brian Blessed, Jason Mamoa, Killing Joke and Public Enemy. In 2013 he published his first book, an overview of the first 20 years of Black Metal. It did really well but Dayal realised that the key financial beneficiaries of his work were the US publisher and so Cult Never Dies was born.

Since then, books on the imprint have sold by the thousand and have been translated in languages across the globe. Black and Underground Metal might be a niche concern within the mainstream but in our globally connected world there are massive networks of fans from Greece to Brazil and Cult Never Dies is a key player. It's not just books either. The company sells merchandise, CDs, cassettes and will have its first vinyl release next year. It also has a strong presence at events in the UK and beyond.


The next focus is on an ambitious book on Halifax gothic metallers Paradise Lost. This feels like a release moving more towards the metal mainstream and future aspirations for projects focusing on the likes of Slayer and Emperor might take the imprint even further in increasing their reader base. Working with Decibel magazine in the US means they can get their books distributed worldwide. There are currently 10 books lined up to be published including an Obituary biography and a fanzine anthology from the 1980s and 90s

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Although he now has an army of writers across the world, Dayal remains very hands-on in the operation – always contributing to the cover design and layout of each release. The passion for what he does is evident and he is a brilliant example of someone making a living from something he believes in, even if to the rest of the world it might seem obscure or niche.

Increasingly, physical space had become an issue for the operation and this led to the relocation from London to Stroud. Dayal loves his new surroundings but is unsure whether his new home is ready for an evening of death metal! "Ha, there's a scene in Bristol and maybe even Gloucester", he says "but we haven't really met any like-minded people musically in Stroud yet. Maybe we'll do something small and see how it goes." I for one think this is an incredibly exciting prospect and with their focus on hauntology, pagan art and alternative



thinking I see no reason why they won't fit into our musical scene just fine... just bring your earplugs!

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The Music Works is a hugely successful local charity for young people in Gloucestershire and it's easy to see why. Their main hub in Kings Square, Gloucester, is a wonderfully sprawling studio space consisting of two state of the art recording studios, a stage, a broadcast lounge, a conference room, a computer room, a kitchen, and plenty of comfy sofas to sit upon and consider the finer points of one's latest musical masterpiece or chew the fat with fellow creatives. It is also fully accessible to those with extra physical health needs, with a custom fitted sensory room complete with vibroacoustic equipment for disabled or hearing impaired young people, a huge range of musical instruments and interfaces to engage those who cannot access conventional instruments, a disabled toilet, an accessible stage, and powered doors throughout the building. It serves up to 2000 young people each year and its importance is such that it has been funded by over 100 organisations including Warner Chappell Music, Pied Piper Appeal, CHK Foundation and The Barnwood Trust. Transforming young people's lives through the power of music is The Music Works' aim, and as well as their state-of-the-art Gloucester studio, they also take their expertise into local schools and they put on regular events including The Kings Jam Festival and Mix and Mash Week. And now their extended arm, The Drop, is coming to

The Drop is a weekly resource for young people aged between ten and eighteen to immerse themselves in all manner of musical activities including singing, recording, song-writing, DJing and production work. As the name suggests, it's a non-booking drop in for anyone who wishes to engage in one or more of the activities mentioned above. There is no pressure to

turn up every week - people can 'drop in' whenever it suits them - and at just £3 per 90 minute session, financial pressures shouldn't be a barrier. The Music Works have been running The Drop sessions in Gloucester and Cinderford for some time, with great success, and now an exciting opportunity has arisen for them to reciprocate it in Stroud. "The drop will take place every Wednesday during term time, from 4:30-6pm at Stroud College," Misha Law, one of the facilitators, explains. "It starts on 27th April and we'd love for as many people to access this as possible."

Misha is a musician and music therapist who has worked with young people for several years and she oversees the sessions alongside senior music leader Issachar Foster. "The Drop is a safe place for people to engage in music in whichever way they wish," she continues. "We don't put any pressure on anyone, however it's always great to see someone progress and make their own music, or for a group of people to go on and form a band." How brilliant! I wish I had had such an amazing resource when I was a teenager, timidly writing songs in my bedroom and then recording them on dodgy D90 cassette tapes that made me sound like I was playing the song seven feet deep at the bottom of a swimming pool. The Music Works, in general, and The Drop, in particular, will be a space for young people to develop their musical skills and meet like-minded others. It will be a place to get expert advice, a place to express oneself, a place to realise one's creative potential. "We work with all genres of music and offer music production sessions as well as band and vocalist sessions," Misha explains. "And we're open to young people from all backgrounds," Issachar adds, "although we're specialists in working with young people in challenging circumstances.'

Honestly, if you are a parent or family friend reading this and you instantly know of a young person who would benefit from this opportunity, let them know immediately, especially if you are aware that music is one of the activities that helps that youngster engage in life better.

The Music Works itself appears to be going from strength to strength. In 2019 they won the Association of Youth Offenders Award for best delivery programme in the UK. In 2021 they received a Queen's Award for enterprise for social mobility and their Creative Director, Malaki Patterson, was nominated for the Inspirational Music Leader Award at the 2021 Youth Music Awards. I might send them one of my old cassette tapes and see if they can digitally remaster it to save it from notoriety...

There are some very useful videos and guidance notes on their brilliant website and the site is well worth a look at, if not for the many music-themed activities they cram into their busy schedule, then certainly for the groovy virtual tour around their inspiring studio. And if, like U2, you still can't find what you are looking for, just ask them. "Got a question?" The website asks. "We're a friendly team and always happy to answer any questions you have!"

WHEN DID YOU START PLAYING MUSIC? WHAT INSTRUMENT DO YOU FEEL MOST COMFORTABLE PLAYING AND WRITING MUSIC WITH? DO YOU WRITE BOTH THE MUSIC AND LYRICS FOR YOUR SONGS?

I started playing music when I was 11 when I went to secondary school. Started by playing the violin which I gave up after a year. I then picked up a guitar and because I could read music I taught myself the notes. Then at the suggestion of my music teacher who could hear I had an ear for bass lines handed me a bass guitar which I fell in love with playing and started playing in bands. As I got older I owned a Roland SH 101 and began my electronic music journey using that, a battered old Amiga computer and an Akai sampler. These days I am happy to write music in my studio and will always begin with a bass or keyboard riff and build things up around that. I write all my own music and write the lyrics too, apart from when I work with Adam Horovitz. We usually sit around and discuss the theme of the music I have written and he will write lyrics to suit. We are both fans of Richard Burton's War of the Worlds effort and I think that shows immensely in our collaborations.

COULD YOU TELL ME ABOUT THE MUSIC THAT MOST INSPIRED YOU TO CREATE THE SIGNATURE SOUND THAT DEFINES YOU NOW?

It would all definitely go back to the early electronic music I was into as a teenager before the rave scene came in. Kraftwerk, early Gary Numan and early Simple Minds such as their albums Empires and Dance and Sons and Fascination. We even do a cover of Simple Minds track 'Celebrate' in

our live set that always goes down well. I'd also say I was influenced by the big beat tunes from the late nineties I used to play when I was a DJ. The optimism and euphoria of that sound I try to weave with the early 80's heavy synths to create a cosmic vibe.

YOU'VE USED THE NAME MR MARKO'S OUTER SPACE EMPORIUM FOR AROUND 8 YEARS NOW, HOW DID YOU COME UP WITH THE NAME?

It came about after I had entered a lynx competition to win a trip into space. For a couple of months the whole of Stroud got behind me to make me Stroud's first astronaut (lol). It inspired me due to my love of astronomy to think about a project that pulled together all my influences into a large collection of cosmic and quantum philosophical ideas to put into my music. I visualised myself as the owner of an emporium selling them. As they were heavily 'outer space' sounding and influenced, I came up with the name for the project from that.

YOU'VE WORKED WITH VOCALIST ANNE GARCIN FOR MANY YEARS, COULD YOU SAY SOMETHING ABOUT HER INVOLVEMENT WITH THE PROJECT?

The original concept of the project was to write instrumentals and get guest vocalists in for certain tracks I'd written vocal tracks for too. After a while of working with several singers, I talked to Anne about doing a track with her. I'd seen her perform in Waking Lucy at one of their gigs a while back and loved her voice. She started with me by recording vocals for 'Great Pretender' which went on to be our first single released on Beatcode last year. We then recorded a couple of other tunes I had written and I then found myself writing more tunes for her to sing on. It clicked and Anne has brought a nice dimension to the project and a fantastic stage presence when we play live. When I write tunes now, if they need vocals I always seem to write with her in mind. The best thing about Anne is that she doesn't realise how great she is. Her live presence makes our shows and I am really grateful she's become our go to vocalist.

THE TITLE TRACK THIS IS A BROADCAST FEATURES THE SOMEWHAT ROBOTISED VOICE OF LOCAL POET ADAM HOROVITZ WHO ALSO WROTE THE WORDS FOR THE SONGS. HOW DID YOU GET ADAM INVOLVED, AND HOW DID HE FEEL ABOUT THE EFFECTS ON HIS VOICE?

I've known Adam since we were teenagers and back in the day I used to do performance poetry at his poetry nights he put on at The Pelican in Stroud. When I started Mr Marko's Outer Space Emporium I wrote a track that would become mine and Adam's first collaboration 'Space Robots of Alpha Centauri.' We enjoyed the writing process, of him listening to my ideas and writing them down in a better way only he could do. I wrote This Is A Broadcast and Adam totally got what I was trying to say and wrote the lyrics and recorded them. We both knew that the vocals should be robotic and after spending two weeks editing them and syncing intricately to get the vocoder robotic effect right with the tones. Both Adam and I thought the effort was worth it.

THE EP WILL BE RELEASED BY LOCAL LABEL BEATCODE RECORDS, HOW DID YOU GET INVOLVED WITH THEM?

Joe Dymond runs Beatcode and we were invited to release a tune after appearing for an interview on his Elements Radio show he was doing for Incapable Staircase. I've known Joe for a long time and we did gigs that he put on for the Electronic Stage at Stroud Fringe Festival a few years back when this project started. We released 'Great Pretender' last April and I liked the way the tracks were mastered and he got what I was trying to do.

NOW THAT WE'RE OUT OF LOCKDOWN, THERE MUST BE OPPORTUNITIES TO PERFORM LIVE TO PROMOTE THE EP. DO YOU HAVE SHOWS PLANNED, AND HOW DO YOU FEEL ABOUT GETTING BACK ON STAGE IN FRONT OF AN AUDIENCE?

Yeah, we are booked to play at The Crown and Sceptre on May 20th and are looking to book some more gigs after the EP comes out. Lockdown did scupper a lot of planned gigs and I must admit I am looking forward to playing live again. It's always fun and I love playing the tracks live and loud. We are also planning a video shoot in for The Valley Circus to be out on our YouTube Channel in time for the release.


SARAH CARTLIDGE

HEXAGON THEATRE COMPANY

The Arsonists, by Max Frisch, is a dark comedy about...well all right...arsonists, but also how the denial of the existence of peril can be the author of that very peril, that sounds like it might resonate these days. The play is to be performed at the Cotswold Playhouse this month by the Hexagon Theatre Company, "you may laugh." Says the poster "But ignore the arsonists at your peril."

"One of our original aims," says Martin Stockwell, actor and co-founder of Hexagon "was if we could get the audience both laughing and crying during a performance that was perfect and we like to think that we leave the audience thinking about something, not just having been entertained for an hour or two."

Hexagon Theatre Company was founded in 1985 and started as it meant to go on by making the bold choice of performing Educating Rita which featured Martin, in the leading role and who also plays Biederman, in The Arsonists. Like the other members of the company, theatre has always been an important part of his life. "I certainly did a little bit of acting when I was at school, and a little bit when I was at university, and then there was a long gap after that. It's been a very important hobby for me and a fairly time consuming, demanding, but rewarding, one." Martin was very happy to join with five like-minded people to set Hexagon on its way: six people... six sides... six points of view.

Carolyn Spice is the director of The Arsonists. "We take turns doing everything," although some do step up for regular jobs, Chris Cockram, an original member of the six, generally builds all the sets, while Mary Moore, also an original, emptied half her study to recreate it on stage for the last play. Carolyn says, "We would love to have somebody who always did things like tech stuff and publicity, but we tend to all turn our hands to everything - most of us really like acting."Martin agrees "My first love is definitely acting, but I quite enjoy directing and somebody's got to do it!"

Amongst Hexagon's triumphs are a "rip-roaring" performance of "Brassed Off" at the Sub Rooms with Chalford Band, back in 2010 (Martin played Danny, the Pete Postlethwaite role) and later Pygmalion directed by Carolyn.

Hexagon were the first amateur theatre group to perform a variety of edgy and interesting plays including Our Country's Good and Winter Hill by Timberlake Wertenbaker, 27 by Abi Morgan - After Electra by April De Angelis. Hexagon welcomes new people, both on stage and backstage. They rarely do a show that doesn't include at least one new person. Not only that, Hexagon have performed plays written by their members. Carolyn's play Breaking the Ice was performed in December 2021. Tim Presland's play. Circus of Desertion was due to be performed as part of the Stroud Theatre Festival in September 2021, but had to be pulled at the last minute because... well, you know...Covid, so it was performed in February. Back in 2011, Katy Albiston, who has written three plays for Hexagon, wrote a futuristic play set in 2020, Power, featuring a female MP who became Minister for Energy and Climate and had to do deals with the Russians for energy...

"One of the best roles I have had in the last few years was to play the PM," Carolyn continues. She played the fictional PM in The Letter of Last Resort by David Greig, a play about the PM's first day in office in which she has to write the letter about what happens if there were to be a nuclear war. "That was a fantastic part, we did it first for the theatre festival and then we put it together with Handbagged (by Moira Buffini) which was about Margaret Thatcher and the Queen." Carolyn studied drama when doing her teacher training and has used drama throughout her career teaching early years children, many with communication difficulties, now she is directing a 14 strong cast in The Arsonists. "I always enjoy it, once I get going, I do find it quite nerve-wracking, but I really love the whole process of bringing a play together, whether I am acting or directing, just actually watching it grow." Martin likens it to being in an orchestra or a band "You have got your part but it's a real thrill when you hear and feel yourself as part of the whole."

Carolyn enjoys being able to achieve her vision for the play, but that vision has had some challenges this time. Hexagon actually chose and started to rehearse and prepare The Arsonists in January 2020. They had to stop in the middle of March and between now and then they have had to replace three members of the cast because of other commitments.

The Arsonists was originally called the "Fire Raisers" and was first performed on stage in 1958. "It had been on our shortlist as The Fire Raisers before we discovered the new version... we were in the Trump era when we started this, but also just thinking about climate change, people just turn a blind eye and accommodate it in some way." Despite the time difference, the play continues to resonate. "It was written with the rise of the Nazis in mind ... I think in the 60s there were productions that were thinking about nuclear weapons and now we're thinking about how Putin has got where he is," not to mention climate change.

Along with the usual preparation, rehearsals, and read-throughs, there are props and costumes to consider. "We spend a lot of time in charity shops looking for the right thing. We don't have one person who does it for a show." Storage is also an issue, they have had to move from an old stable to a shed and soon they will need to move again. Anyone got a spare shed? Lock up? Barn? "I've got all the props at home for this play, including a fireman's hose that Alexa Jones blagged, a discontinued hose that was donated by the fire station," with a special mention for Louise Townsend, who, as well as kitting out the whole cast, has made a fabric goose and accompanying vegetables for this next performance.

And when is that performance? May 12th, 13th, and 14th at the Cotswold Playhouse - make sure you know where your matches are!
