

THE LONG TABLE-SUMMER SESSIONS

ROBIN LAYFIELD CAUGHT UP WITH WILL NORTH AND CARINA PRICE FROM THE LONG TABLE AND LOCAL DJ WILL MENDOZA WHO ARE COLLABORATING ON SOMETHING REALLY SPECIAL THIS SUMMER IN THE LONG TABLE'S UNIQUE VENUE IN BRIMSCOMBE. TIME FOR BREAKING BREAD AND BEATS...

SO TELL ME A LITTLE ABOUT THE LONG TABLE?

WILL NORTH: "The Long Table at its simplest is a restaurant where we work towards answering the question of 'what if everyone in our community had access to great food and people to eat it with?' It all starts with the food, finding the best local ingredients and local producers to showcase the incredible food that the five valleys have to offer. The thing we do differently is that all of our meals are 'pay as you can' - making sure that everyone can access the amazing food on the table, whether you've lost your job or your wallet - you can come and join us at the table. We've been here in our new home at Brimscombe Mill for just over a year and in that time 23,500 people have eaten with us and around 11% of those accessed a meal paid forward by our community grabbing a seat at our table, paying what you can afford and chatting with your neighbours is where true community is built. The Long Table was started in 2018 by Tom Herbert and Will Mansell. It was really simple, just a shipping container with some tables borrowed from the Furniture Bank and it grew from being 10 people around the table to 150 or more. Now

when we have events we can get 200 to 400 people coming through our doors. We talk about 'Badical Hospitality' - taking back the hospitality industry and looking at things differently. That is exactly what we do here - we pay fair wages and we make sure that everyone gets paid. We don't use volunteers on site, we are proud that we pay all our team and this includes our partners. If we have guest chefs, musicians and DJs it's not about being cap-in-hand - valuing people's time is important to us. Art is sustenance and we want to make sure that people are able to survive and to create the art which adds to our community."

WILL MENDOZA IS WELL-KNOWN IN STROUD, ONE OF THE DJS BEHIND STROUD BLOCK PARTY AND THE RECENT 'DE LA BRATION' AT SVA. WILL HAS ALWAYS BEEN OBSESSED WITH MUSIC, THE DISCOVERY OF NEW MUSIC AND SHARING HIS ENTHUSIASM WITH EVERYONE AROUND HIM. HE STARTED OUT MAKING TAPES TO PASS AROUND AND RAPIDLY MOVED ON TO VINYL. HE LOVES A GOOD FILM SOUNDTRACK. WHAT'S IT LIKE DJING AROUND HERE, WILL?

WILL MENDOZA: "I only DJ in Stroud and the surrounding area and I've done that ever since I moved here 13 years ago. I see this as a kind of community service! It's an important part of the community and it brings people together. We're really lucky, we have people with the broadest musical tastes which is great for me because I don't just play one genre. What's really interesting about Stroud is that you end up with a broad range of ages at an event. When you play in the city, you get this crowd or that crowd but here it's that mixture of ages, so I can have people coming up to me that recognise something from the 50s or 60s and then someone much vounger who's buzzing off that Columbian track liust played that was on a Netflix series. For me though, it's all about creating an atmosphere. I mean,

ultimately it's about getting people to dance but in the early evening i'm here to build the mood.

THE SUMMER SESSIONS IS A SERIES OF EARLY EVENING MUSIC AND FOOD EVENTS THAT THE LONG TABLE ARE HOLDING THROUGHOUT THE SUMMER AND INTO AUTUMN, FEATURING DJS AND BANDS WITH THEMED MUSIC AND MEALS, TO CREATE THAT PERFECT COMBINATION OF GOOD FEELING, CONVERSATION, FOOD AND DANCING TO WHILE AWAY THE SUMMER EVENINGS... SO HOW DID IT ALL COME ABOUT?

WILL M: "Well, we had a party didn't we? Kind of the opposite of the Summer sessions, it was a ski party and it was freezing cold but we had such a good time and that's what inspired this. We both thought that we can do this. I'm so interested in how music can work in a community setting, also that combination of food and music. The events we host will pair the food with whatever is the theme of the music, whether it's me playing, or a guest DJ or a guest band, and that's what makes it so interesting."

HOW ARE THE SUMMER SESSIONS ORGANISED? HOW OFTEN WILL THEY RUN?

CARINA: "We started in June and we have more events planned for July, August and September. We'll be holding around two to three events a month. We're giving people lots of reasons to come to the Long Table and we're supporting local bands and DJs and those from further afield."

WILL M: "At the same time it's free to the public as well. The biggest event I was involved in, which was Stroud Block Party - part of Stroud Fringe - that was a community event too. All of the community, they turned up en masse but no-one had to pay. That takes out a divide, it means that you can come and access things that you wouldn't ordinarily be able to if you had to pay for them."

CARINA: "Opportunity of access is a core value of our work and being able to pay for tickets to events should never be a barrier. For this reason all of our Summer events are free, and if for any reason an event held here is ticketed, it is always on a 'pay as you can' basis."

TELL ME ABOUT THE MUSIC...

WILL M: "I make playlists that get played inside but essentially what I try to do is make the music accessible to as broad of a group as possible of different ages but it's never going for the obvious, it's that balance. So I'll find a really interesting cover version. Someone knows the song but they don't know that version of it and that's how I keep it interesting. I know from having DJ'd for years that this works, it's different. One of the things that we wanted to do was to use these events to raise awareness of what The Long Table is doing. We're exploring how you can combine music and food that works in the way that we think it will."

I leave the last words to Carina: "Nothing makes us happier than seeing this place packed with people eating, drinking and sitting outside chatting. It's what we're all here for. Amazing things happen when we eat together!

The Long Table Summer Sessions will be running from 6-11pm on Saturdays through July, August and September, with themed food served from 6-8pm. The next one will take place on July 15th and DJ Will Mendoza will be playing a mix of genres on vinyl including soul, reggae, funk, jazz, disco and hip hop. Steve Ferbrache is the lead singer of Stroud-based band The Achievers, whose latest album Easy Going Days will be released on June 30th. The band formed ten years ago after meeting in a pub, and, despite Steve claiming most of them to be 'blow-ins', they've since made the town their home. "I've been assured that's just about long enough to be justified in feeling mildly uncomfortable about more recent blow-ins," he jokes.

The Achievers are made up of five members - Steve (vocals and guitar), Aron Attwood (drums and vocals), Rufus Fry (harmonica and vocals), Jack Thomas (bass) and Robert Holmes (guitar and vocals); "Like most bands, the story of how we got started is pretty banal," Steve says. "We do have eclectic tastes, though. But the common language that we all speak musically is Americana and blues."

The band have come a long way since their debut album - Live at the SVA - was released in 2018. They were nominated for band of the year at the 2020 UK Blues Awards and they headlined the Acoustic Stage at last year's Upton Blues Festival. Their live performances, in particular, have gained them great respect. They are widely regarded as having that rare ability to be able to read the mood of an audience as they perform and then react accordingly, organically tempering their playing to suit the ambience of the crowd they're performing for. Basically, they don't turn up with a tried and tested formula or a premeditated box of tricks. This makes it hard for anyone to define who they really are, and that seems to be what makes the band tick. "It's hard to explain just how fantastic The Achievers are as a live band," Mid-Wales Blues Club owner Jim Kerslake says. "You really do have to be there to appreciate the way that they fill a venue with such a good-time relaxed atmosphere."

So what should we expect from Easy Going Days when it's released later this month? Other than the usual array of un-defining colours, that is. "It's ten largely unconnected songs that don't quite fit into either roots, rock, pop, blues or Americana music," Steve explains, "and yet the album is probably all those things at the same time." Fans of the band will know what to expect, and they will have been waiting patiently, as this is The Achievers' first major release since the pandemic struck in March 2020.

"We're not sure why people like us," Steve muses, humbly. "Many of the songs tell the same story. But enough people like what we do for us to keep making music together, and to tour internationally. I suppose that's our inspiration really....that, and making an album in the fourth quarter of the financial year, which is a pretty decent tax-dodge haha!"

The Achievers will be touring Croatia in July, and they'll also be doing a ten-year anniversary tour around the UK in the autumn, playing to audiences in equally exotic stops such as Tewkesbury, Leamington Spa and London Town. Beyond that, though, the future is rather uncertain. "We'll either break up or just stop trying to maintain a national profile on the blues/roots scene," Steve answers candidly. "It's been exhausting, and costly." There will no doubt be people reading this with alarm, hoping that it's just another of his funny little quips. I don't know one way or the other - I've only just got to know him. The best thing you can do is to attend one of their forthcoming gigs and find out for yourself. Whatever he tells you about the band's destiny, one thing's for certain - you'll bear witness to a bloody great evening of live music.

RHIAN HARRIS-MUSSI

WHEN I TALK TO RHIAN HARRIS-MUSSI SHE IS IN CUMBRIA, **SPENDING A MONTH WORKING** WITH AND LEARNING FROM **CHARLIE WHINNEY, A LEADING EXPERT ON STEAM BENDING** WOOD. RHIAN IS AN ARTIST **WORKING ACROSS MEDIUMS AND FORMS. HER WORK IS ESSENTIALLY CONCEPTUAL; CONCERNED WITH IDEAS, BUT HER CURRENT PLACEMENT AS 'THE STEAM BENDER'S APPRENTICE' IS PART OF AN ON-GOING PRACTICE OF ACQUIRING** AND REFINING HER MATERIAL SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE. SHE HAS ALWAYS BEEN **INTERESTED IN DESIGN AND FINE WOODWORKING, AND MAKING IS CENTRAL TO HER FINE ART** PRACTICE.

Her most recent work has a kind of cleanness and finesse, and a suggestion of functionality, that evokes European modernist design. Skeip is a series of wedge shaped boxes, constructed out of dark hardwood and faced with frosted acrylic, apparently held in place by finely constructed wooden clips. Set into the acrylic are marquetry panels that use contrasting timber veneers to depict abstracted landscape-like images. They are like exquisitely made. analogue photographs made of wood, laid in careful asymmetry onto a finely crafted lightbox. The juxtaposition of materials, the organic with the synthetic; the clarity of construction; the use of decorative woodworking techniques in a contemporary art object; the sloping surface, all contribute to a certain unsettling but engaging ambiguity - what are these objects? Might they have a function?

They might be control panels for some advanced technology, and indeed Rhian describes them as time machines. The marquetry panels do show landscapes, imagined as if seen from an aircraft flying above. The aerial photograph is one of the tropes of Modernism, the world seen from a god-like, detached perspective. Rhian says that she was thinking of an essay written by Virginia Woolf









when the work was conceived, in which she imagines herself flying over London. Woolf had in-fact never flown in an aeroplane. The essay was a vehicle for her imagination. She dreams of rising over the city and seeing through the man-made surface to the natural landscape beneath, history somehow embedded and revealed in the flattened topography. There is an undercurrent of environmental anxiety in the work, and my first response to the images was to think of the opening sequences from the film Bladerunner 2049, in which the protagonist flies slowly over a future landscape, despoiled and reordered, in which nature is present only as a trace memory.

This environmental concern is more explicit in Refugium, a work made in 2021, consisting of a series of objects that are suggestive of equipment from a futuristic bioscience lab. Here there is a direct filmic reference to Silent Running, a 1972 film in which, following an ecological disaster, the preserved remnants of Earth's plant life have been collected and are being transported in vast bio-domes to be reestablished on another planet - a mission that ends with a single surviving dome, drifting through deep space towards an uncertain future. Again, these are beautifully made, furniture-like pieces. There is something about the careful construction that signals seriousness of intention. It gives the work a kind of gravity - even where they make playful reference to the bio-domes and robot gardeners from the film. The work carries an affecting narrative without being merely illustrative. The bringing together of traditional craft skills, material sensuality and beauty with the uncertainties of Twentieth Century Modernism and dystopian futurism (retro-futurism) contributes to an instability of meaning that is questioning and thought-provoking.

Rhian is reflective and erudite. There is a sense of inquiry in the work that draws on a rich range of technical, literary and filmic sources. Speculative fiction is a key reference point: a broad genre that includes science fiction, and which seems to have become a particularly useful device for our times, inviting an imaginative leap beyond the world 'as it is', or as it appears to be. This feeds a vital need when, faced with climate crisis and all that follows from that in terms of environmental destruction, war and migration, inequality and the contradictions inherent in neoliberalism, there is a pervasive narrative that 'there is no alternative' - no alternative to globalised capitalism, no alternative to fossils fuels. Art can help us to overcome this barrier to imagining a better future... and perhaps craft know-how, has a part to play in lending a sense of agency, a capacity for shaping the future in material ways.

Having originally studied fine art at Ruskin College Oxford, which has nurtured a rigorous intellectual foundation to her work, Rhian has found a paradoxical freedom in developing an art practice that is underpinned by slowly acquired, rules based, technical and material knowledge. She developed her marquetry skills through a course on the Highgrove Traditional Crafts programme and this led her, through encouragement and a contact from her tutor at Highgrove, to get in touch with Charlie Whinney. She feels that a certain generosity of spirit, with the sharing of connections and knowledge, is a characteristic of the craft world that is a contrast to the protectiveness that sometimes surrounds other art practices.

Currently based in London, Rhian grew up in Stroud and will be returning to make new work at SVA as part of their Young Artists Residency programme. Through the residency she will be revisiting Information Superhighway, a shared exhibition in the Line Gallery at SVA with Oliver Offord in 2016, before they took up their undergraduate studies. Here, the detached and remote aerial photograph, in the form of Google Earth satellite imagery, will be mapped onto the landscapes in which she has walked for most of her life. This picks-up another aspect of Woolf's essay – the traffic between distant abstraction and the familiar, close, physical experience of actually being in a landscape; between past and present, memory and place.

THE GLOUCESTERSHIRE GUILD OF CRAFTSMEN

THE GLOUCESTERSHIRE GUILD OF CRAFTSMEN IS CELEBRATING ITS 90TH BIRTHDAY THIS YEAR WITH AN EXHIBITION AT THE MUSEUM IN THE PARK. A CHANCE TO SEE BEAUTIFUL CRAFTS AND LEARN MORE ABOUT THE ORIGINS OF THE GUILD.

The 1930s was the time of inflation and high unemployment and young people leaving rural areas to find work in cities. In early 1933 the Gloucestershire Rural Industries Committee drew together local craftspeople at a conference to find out what kind of support they needed to maintain the quality of their work while making it economically sustainable. The main problems that emerged were finding customers willing to pay for good work. On top of that, taking on an apprentice for a sole maker was also seen as difficult as they couldn't promise a job at the end of it. The solution was to set up the Guild of Gloucestershire Craftsmen, with professional makers at the top of their game (though women were allowed to join too).

Guilds have been around since mediaeval times providing a similar function, managing the quality and controlling who could and couldn't join. The City of London is host to many beautiful old buildings from the peak of the national trade guilds' financial power. Some of them put funding towards training and apprenticeship programmes to keep the intangible skills of their sectors alive. Today membership of this local guild is not expensive and they are open to new membership applications.

There were already notable designers and makers in the area, from C. R. Ashbee, who moved his Guild of Handicraft in Chipping Campden in 1902, to Ernest Gimson at Daneway House and the Whiteway Colony founded in 1898. One of the early members of the guild was Michael Cardew of Winchcombe Pottery, which is still going today. This exhibition will be a rare chance to see some early pieces by members such as Cardew, fabrics from Gerry Carter, the textile printers Baron and Larcher, linen weaver Rita Beales and metal work from George Hart. The Hart family continue to make silverware in Chipping Campden.



The exhibition looks forwards too, with contemporary works by mosaic artist Cleo Mussi, rug maker Jesse James, willow basket maker Susan Early, jeweller Sarah Pulvertaft, paper sculptor Liz Valenti and textiles from Liz Lippiat among many others.

I spoke to outgoing chair and leatherworker, Val Michael about the trainees that she takes on with external funding, so she can pass on the hand skills that you can't learn from a book or a film. For her the guild is about community, sharing knowledge with other makers and the opportunity for training in new skills, such as digital marketing. She enjoys markets, responsible for starting the regular Cirencester Craftsman market, and meeting her buyers, to whom she offers continuity. They pay her back with loyalty, coming back for repairs and more purchases.


Alongside the exhibition the Museum is hosting workshops so you can have a go yourself. There is also a panel discussion on the 8th July posing the question: What role can the Gloucestershire Guild and Craft Guilds in general play in the 21st century?

If you're interested to know more, I recommend looking at the Arts and Crafts Movement Collection at The Wilson at Cheltenham and well-researched books on the subject by Mary Greensted, a former chair of the Guild.

These days the Guild enjoys a new shop in Montpellier, Cheltenham selling the fine wares of some of its 70 members. The battle of making a living as a craftsperson remains and the challenge of keeping a micro-business afloat makes finding time to pass on skills as hard as it was 90 years ago. So, go and appreciate their work, have a go at a workshop and buy something if you can...

The 90th Anniversary Exhibition of the Gloucestershire Guild Of Craftsmen (1933-2023) is on now at the Museum in the Park and runs until the 16th July. Visit **guildcrafts.org.uk** and **museuminthepark.org.uk** for further info.

DIALECT

THIS BEAUTIFUL PART OF THE WORLD PROVIDES ENDLESS INSPIRATION FOR ASPIRING WRITERS, BUT CAN THOSE OF US WHO LIVE IN THE COUNTRYSIDE HOPE TO HAVE THE SAME OPPORTUNITIES AND ACCESS TO SERVICES AS OUR CITY-DWELLING FRIENDS? SARAH EDGHILL MEETS A WOMAN WHO HAS MADE IT HER MISSION IS TO ENSURE EXACTLY THAT...

Juliette Morton is the sort of person who does everything at warp speed. She combines her day job as a global educational consultant with her own work as a poet and author, while also running Dialect, an online literary writers' platform. Plus, there's a house, a husband, two young children, a dog... you get the picture.

Not put off by the negativity of her school careers officer and the multiple choice questionnaire that suggested she might become a prison officer Juliette did an English degree, followed by an MA, a PhD and then a Creative Writing MA, during which she worked on a novel set in the Niger Delta. When she found she was pregnant with her first child, writing had to be temporarily put on the back burner. "But it was always on my mind, like an obsessive-compulsive disorder!" she says. "After a few years, I discovered that poetry was perfect for fitting into the cracks of my life as a mother: I would stand waiting for the kettle to boil or the pasta to cook on the stove and I'd be writing things down. Rediscovering writing at that stage in my life was like turning on a tap and I haven't stopped since."

But while she was inspired by her passion for writing, Juliette found there was little in the way of local support. "When I lived in London, I could go out of my house, walk ten minutes down the road and be in the presence of a Novel Laureate, absorbing wisdom by osmosis! If you live in any city there's a lot going on, but in rural areas it feels harder and, when I moved to Stroud, I couldn't find writers' groups or courses. All I could access was distance learning."

Having identified this gap in the market, Juliette decided to stop moaning about it and do something to fill it. In 2020, she ran some workshops and summer school sessions funded by Bath Spa University for isolated rural writers, then set up a website and Dialect was born. Over the last three years the literary platform has gone from strength to strength and now offers courses, retreats, workshops and mentoring for rural writers, with the aim of developing talent and giving participants the chance to share their work. "Dialect is about opening up access and telling different types of stories," she explains. "It's a huge boost for people to see their words in print. We often see so much potential in writers; there's already an energy there, along with excitement and inspiration, they just need to polish their work. We're trying to offer help and advice to the whole spectrum - from the beginner who's mucking about with words and just having fun, to someone who really wants to write for a living.

Last autumn, Juliette applied to turn Dialect into a Community Interest Company, which has meant she can access more funding to help with administration, promotion and project-management. Moving forward, this will make a big difference in terms of the amount and variety of support and services she can offer local writers. She is brimming with ideas for the future, but admits it hasn't always been easy. "I'm working this stuff out on my own, feeling my way in the dark. I've worked in the third sector and public sector most of my life, trying to run something that isn't commercial or profit making, but you still need the same skills that you need to run a business. I've had to teach myself to do everything from web design to sending out mailings."


She has recruited an impressive list of fellow authors and poets, who run sessions for Dialect and offer mentoring. "There are monthly sessions where writers can share their work in progress," she explains. "Some want to get published, others just want to tell stories about their families, or work through issues about their relationships. There are also slots on a guest blog and an annual anthology for the writing community."

Dialect now has its own publishing arm, Dialect Press, which has recently produced its first publication, Glos Mythos, co-written by Juliette and Emma Kernahan, with illustrations by Bill Jones. "Working with those two has been a match made in heaven, it's been hilarious. It's fantastic that local bookshops have really gotten behind the book as well."

Another new project is DIRT, an experiment in carbon-neutral publishing using unbleached paper and vegetable inks. Juliette collaborated with fellow poet Alice Willits on a poem published on compostable paper. "With every purchase of the pamphlet we give people a pack of seeds, so they can plant the poem afterwards. Alice and I met at Coventry Cathedral to collaborate on the poem and it was a perfect place for what we wanted to do with DIRT: creating something in the ashes of an environment that has been destroyed and discussing how to rebuild from there."

Juliette's own writing career is progressing apace. Last November, she won the inaugural Laurie Lee Prize at Stroud Book Festival, for her piece of non-fiction Source Material, she's just won the Poetry Society's Geoffrey Dearmer Award for the best single poem by poet who's yet to publish a full collection and she has just got a deal with Broken Sleep Books for her first poetry collection. "Broken Sleep is such an interesting publisher, shaking things up in the poetry world, which has traditionally been quite staid."

This whirlwind of a human being has big plans for the future of Dialect – from setting up regular writing courses for young people, to running retreats which offer built-in childcare – and, although her daily 'to do' list must be terrifyingly long, you get the impression she races through it and manages to tick off most of the items before the rest of us have staggered out of bed and poured cereal into a breakfast bowl. This is a woman who isn't daunted by something as dull as convention. "I'm a doer," she admits. "But I'm also enthusiastic about it all, and that's what keeps me going. I believe in this and get energy from the people who come along to Dialect and who gain something from what we're offering."






